4. General Assembly 2015

EGU overall decreased since 2014 (-4%), the final tally of HS is 1898 abstracts (-6%), 12.5% of the total. We now are filling the building without overstretching.

- EGU: 14231 abstracts, 4900 oral (34%), 8608 posters (60%), 723 PICOs (5%)
- HS: 577 orals (32%), 1105 posters (62%), 98 PICOs (5%)
- HS program comprises 75 sessions
- The scheduling for HS was done by Laurent Pfister this year.



5. Outstanding Student Posters: report + awards

Rewards the best posters of young scientists (graduate students and recently completed PhDs)

- Coordinators: Julian Klaus, Ilja van Meerveld, Andreas Güntner (EGU)
- 143 posters in the competition (2014: 377; 2013: 85; 2012: 184)
- 59 sessions



5. Outstanding Student Posters: report + awards

Procedure for participating

- (PhD-) students register their wish to enter the competition when uploading their abstract
- 3 judges per poster
- Criteria: scientific quality, presentation, and discussion
- Top 1-5 of the ranked posters win the OSP Award (depending on number of posters in competition)

Benefits of participating:

- 3 judges per poster come to talk to you
- Feedback on poster

If you win:

- short presentation on the EGU website
- conference fee waived for the next GA
- when the work is subsequently published in HESS, the page charges will be waived

Procedure for poster assessment

- New online system:
 - Conveners ask and assign judges
 - Judges automatically receive email and link to the assessment form
 - Judges fill in assessment form or upload assessment directly

for innovative contributions to the advancement of systems methods for the sustainable management of the world's water resources.



EGU Galileo conferences

- Address well-focused cutting-edge topics at the frontier of geosciences research.
- 3-5 days meeting for discussion and debate for about 100 participants.
- EGU provides comprehensive organisational support allowing organizing committees to focus on the scientific aspects.
- EGU is partly sponsoring the event. Financial loss or benefit go to EGU.
- 2-stage application process on-line. “Deadline” for 1st round of applications **November 30th 2015** (submission page coming up in summer).
- Submission from September 1st, 2015
