8. ST Education and Public Outreach

9. ANGEO Update

On behalf of Christoph Jacobi, Editor in Chief, MH presented an update of Annales Geophysicae (see slides 32ff of the DM presentation at http://www.egu.eu/st/reports/2018_slides_st.pdf). The most important update is that ANGEO is now the journal for both the ST and PS Divisions. End of 2017 the extension to the PS science has been incorporated. Ingrid Mann has been approved as the new "PS" Editor-in-Chief. Also, the new 2-stage review process is now in place. As such, ANGEO can be considered as a considerably updated journal for Solar and planetary sciences. We very much hope that with these changes ANGEO will have a bright future. MH would like to thank the science officers for their active involvement in the new set-up of the journal.

10. 2018 GA/ST Scientific Programme

Overall statistics of the 2018 General Assembly, as well as the ST Scientific Programme are shown in the ST DM presentation (see meeting slides). In summary, the number of abstracts stayed almost the same compared to 2017. Further, MH reminded the participants that PICO sessions are an excellent way to communicate science results and at the same time accommodate a large number of abstracts. In case the number of abstracts will generally continue to rise for the GA in the coming year(s), the possibility to submit PICO sessions will become increasingly important in order to host all abstracts within the conditions at the conference center regarding available time blocks as well as space.

11. New rules for EGU GA 2019

- No solicited presentations by conveners: "Authors (first and co-authors) should not have a solicited presentation in a session they (co-)convene. (Co)-conveners should not be presenting author, and are discouraged from being co-author, on oral presentations in a session they convene."
- <u>1 abstract rule:</u> "Authors are allowed as first author to submit either one regular abstract plus one abstract solicited by a convener, or two solicited abstracts."
- Number of conveners on a session: At session submission minimum 2 maximum 5
- Number of convenerships as a recommendation: 1 as main convener, maximum 3 (co-) convenerships total

Comments by the audience:

Kalevi Musala pointed out that many years ago it was common to have (invited) review talks for 30 minutes at EGU. This is missing in the way the programme is scheduled.

12. EGU 2019 and the Future

EGU2019 will be held in Vienna, Austria from 7-12 April 2019.

MH asked the scientific community for their active involvement in shaping the EGU GA and reminded the audience of the bottom-up process of EGU. As last year, MH would like to encourage the community to propose sessions for EGU2019, in particular Joint Sessions organized together with other divisions, such as e.g. the AS, CL, and PS Divisions, as well as others. It should also be noted that Interdisciplinary events (IE) are a separate programme group and also considered when proposing sessions.
