





- 22 division awards for Outstanding Early Career Scientists and General Assembly awards for students



The EGU Awards & Medals:

At Union level:

- The Union Medals for senior scientists including the most prestigious awards made by the Union that are associated with an EGU Honorary Membership. Arthur Holmes Medal (J-P. Brun, T. Torsvik, C. Laj, K. Burke, S. Cloetingh, V. Courtillot, ...)
- The Union Arne Richter Outstanding Early Career Scientists Awards

At Division level:

- The Division Outstanding Early Career Scientist Award (1)
- The Division Augustus Love Medal for a distinguished scientist (1).

In relation with its General Assemblies, EGU presents the Outstanding Student & PhD (OSPP) Award to further improve the overall quality of presentations and, most importantly, to foster the excitement of younger colleagues in presenting their work.







The Division Outstanding Early Career Scientist Award (OECS award) recognizes scientific achievements in the field covered by the related Division, made by an early career scientist.

Early career scientist:

<7 years from highest degree (normally PhD) (no age limitation)

Selection procedure:

by votes of the GD Science Officers

The "winner" of the Division OECS award competes for the Arne Richter EGU OECS award with other divisions OECS award winners





The Augustus Love Medal is awarded to a distinguished scientist in the field of geodynamics, comprising mantle and core convection, tectonophysics, post-glacial rebound and earth rotation.



The medal has been exclusively designed for the EGU by József Kótai.







GD Medal Committee

Composition of the Division Medal committees:

- Chair: Term is one year and can be renewed 3 times.
- Minimum three additional members, including past medalists/awardees. <u>Term is one year, but can be renewed three times</u>. At least one member of the committee is replaced every year.
- Division president as ex-officio member.
- Chair of the Union Awards Committee as ex-officio member.

- Candidates do not need to be EGU members.
- Individual award and medal committees are then evaluating the nominations selecting the most deserving candidate based on **scientific achievements**

- When nominating please think about people who may have been overlooked in your discipline.
- If you do not nominate nobody will.

OSPP: Outstanding Student and PhD candidate Presentation contest

What is evaluated?

- scientific content (relevance, methods, ...)
- presentation (organization, aesthetic appeal, ability to answer questions, ...)

Who votes?

- 3 pre-defined judges per participating presentation
- ALL EGU participants (from post-doc level on, not co-author, no shared affiliation) can vote as well on abstract page!
- WE NEED YOU!!!

Who can participate?

- first and presenting author
- either currently a BSc or MSc student or PhD candidate
- or last degree obtained in year of GA

Why participate?

- Better visibility for your research
- Award certificate and ceremony
- Free open-access publication in one of the EGU journals
- Conference fee waiver for next EGL







Outstanding Student and PhD candidate Presentation (OSPP) Award

Eligible for the **OSPP Award** are students that:

- are <u>first author and personally present</u> the poster at the conference AND
- satisfy one of the following criteria:
 - o are a current BSc, MSc, or PhD student OR
 - are a recent undergraduate or postgraduate student (conferral of degree after 1
 January of the year preceding the conference) who are presenting their thesis work.

This year (EGU 2023):

- 58 participants in GD
- ~80 evaluators






Number of Active Abstracts 2005-2023



16,646 active scheduled abstracts (as of 12 April)








EGU23 Registration Statistics (as of 17 Apr)

- 16,604 active scheduled abstracts
- 15,319 total registrations (13,287 on-site / 2,032 virtual)
- ~13% of total participants registered for virtual participation
- 40% of total participants are PhD candidates, Master or Undergraduate students (~ 25% participating virtually)
- ~ 5% of registered participants from low- & lower-middle income countries (approx. equally distributed onsite & virtual participation)
- **Gender**: male (~ 57 %) and female (~ 39 %), with less difference between percentages for virtual participation






