### 1. EGU22 is first time hybrid

- Was planned for a long time;
- And were in constant adaptation due to covid19-related rules;
- Wanted so much to run it physical and therefore, were bound to change dates;
- ✓ vEGU22 will almost fully mirror the physical EGU22;



### • Why did you change the date of EGU22 from early April to late May?

This decision was made in January at the beginning of the omicron wave. There was considerable anxiety within the community about attending an in-person event in these conditions. Moreover, Austria limited the maximum event size to 2000 seated people (and even less standing), with no indication of when that rule would be relaxed.

Under these conditions, when the ACV proposed an alternative date (due to the cancellation of another conference) we decided to do this, in order to maximise the chance of having an in-person component to EGU22



• Will the date of the General Assembly change again in future?

This was the first time in the history of the EGU General Assembly that we have had to change the date and we sincerely hope it will be the last!

We are currently not announcing the date of the the 2023 General Assembly because we are still discussing with the ACV. Originally it was planned for early April but we hope to find again a date in May so as to be more resilient with regards to possible new Covid infection waves.



### Why are there no posters or PICOs this year?

We originally had to provide a hygiene plan to the Austrian authorities. Including posters and PICOs in the programme appeared as a major risk in getting the plan approved.

Large numbers of non-seated people mixing in closed spaces are viewed as too much of a risk to our attendee's health, safety and well-being in the current pandemic situation.




• Austria relaxed the Covid regulations. Why are you maintaining the 2G and mask requirements?

The Austrian authorities announced the relaxation of the regulations after our deadline for on-site registration. Due to the requirements of our conference hygiene plan, it was not possible to re-open the registration. We felt that participants had signed up for an in-person event under certain conditions and we did not want to modify this after participants had registered. The health and safety of all participants is our primary concern. In addition, we were advised to maintain a 2G conference given the unpredictable nature of regulation changes.




## EGU22: Registration numbers and breakdown

- On-site participants: 88 countries





This medal was established by the Natural Hazards Division to <u>recognise</u> <u>interdisciplinary natural-hazard research</u>. The name of Gaius Plinius Secundus (~23 – 79 A.D.) acknowledges the role of our ancestors working to improve both knowledge and mitigation of natural hazards.

From 2002–2003 (EGS) and 2004–2011 (EGU) it was awarded to early career scientists.

Since 2012 the medal recognizes interdisciplinary research in natural hazards by <u>active scientists</u>. Its is awarded to outstanding <u>active</u> scientists who meet the following criteria: outstanding research achievements in fields related with natural hazards, important interdisciplinary activity in two or more fields related with this topic, and research that has been applied in the mitigation of risks from natural hazards.

The Plinius medal was established by the Division on <u>Natural Hazards</u> to recognise interdisciplinary research on natural hazards. The name of <u>Gaius Plinius Secundus</u> (AD 23/24 – 79), "Plinius the Elder", acknowledges the role of all the scientists who have worked to improve knowledge, understanding, and mitigation of natural hazards and their consequences. In 2002 by the European Geophysical Society (EGS), and from 2004 to 2011 by the <u>European Geosciences Union</u>, the Plinius medal was awarded to early career scientists. Then, from 2012 to 2022, the medal was awarded by the EGU to mid-career and/or active scientists.

Beginning in 2023, the EGU Natural Hazards Division shall award the Plinius Medal to outstanding scientists who meet all the following criteria: outstanding research achievements in fields related with natural hazards, important interdisciplinary activity in two or more fields related with this topic, and research that has impact on society. All criteria must be demonstrated by verifiable evidence.



#### **Soloviev and Plinius Medal Committees**

Rules for Committee\*:

<u>Chair</u>: Nominated. Term is one year and can be renewed 3 times (4 years).

Members: 4 nominated

(usually past medallists, <u>recommended at least one member</u> who is not a past medallist and one ECS).

Term is one year and can be renewed 3 times (4 years), one member replaced **each year**.

\*Ideally want mixture of genders, career stages and disciplines within NH.

Ex-officio: Division President and chair of the Union Awards Committee.
