

In relation with its General Assemblies, EGU presents the Outstanding Student & PhD (OSPP) Award to further improve the overall quality of presentations and, most importantly, to foster the excitement of younger colleagues in presenting their work.





The Division Outstanding Early Career Scientist Award (OECS award) recognizes scientific achievements in the field covered by the related Division, made by an early career scientist.

Early career scientist:

<7 years from highest degree (normally PhD) (no age limitation)

Selection procedure:

by votes of the GD Science Officers

How to become an awardee?


- Nominations are exclusively by EGU members (no self nomination)*

- Individual award and medal committees are then evaluating the nominations selecting the most deserving candidate based on **scientific achievements****.

- * An exception is one award to promote excellence in journalism allowing nominations from non-members and self nominations
- ** plus one medals each for journalism, outreach and service to the union

- ALL EGU participants (from post-doc level on, not co-author, no shared affiliation) can vote as well on abstract page!

Why participate?

EGU24: numbers at a glance (as of 4 April 2024)

- 19,319 active scheduled abstracts
- 16.746 paid registrations (8% for virtual participation)
- 50% of virtual participants benefited from free registration (Undergraduate/master students & Low- & lower-middle income countries)
- 37% of on-site participants and 52% of virtual participants are PhD candidates, Master or Undergraduate students
- 2% of on-site participants and 24% of virtual participants are from Low & Lower-middle income countries
- Gender (Female / Male / Non-binary): On-site (39% / 58% / 0%)
 & Virtual (42% / 54% / 1%)
- 112 different countries for on-site participation; 90 for virtual participation



Abstracts per Programme Group (PG)




