


Medals and Awards

- The Division Augustus Love Medal for a distinguished scientist (1).


In relation with its General Assemblies, EGU presents the Outstanding Student & PhD (OSPP) Award to further improve the overall quality of presentations and, most importantly, to foster the excitement of younger colleagues in presenting their work.



- Nominations are exclusively by EGU members* while candidates do not need to be EGU members. (*An exception is one award to promote excellence in journalism allowing nominations from non-members and self nominations)
- Individual award and medal committees are then evaluating the nominations selecting the most deserving candidate based on scientific achievements**. (**plus one medals each for journalism, outreach and service to the union)

- All members are strongly encouraged to contribute to the awards program by nominating suitable candidates.
- When nominating please think about people who may have been overlooked in your discipline.
- If you do not nominate nobody will.

The Division Outstanding Early Career Scientist Award (OECSA) recognizes scientific achievements in the field covered by the related Division, made by an early career scientist.

Early career scientist:

<7 years from highest degree (normally PhD) (no age limitation)

Selection procedure:

by votes of the Division Officers

The "winner" of the Division OECSA competes for the Arne Richter EGU OECSA with other divisions OECSA winners

The 2022 Augustus Love Medal is awarded to David Bercovici for fundamental and long-lasting contributions that advance our understanding of the dynamics and evolution of mantle convection, lithospheric rheology and plate tectonics.

David Bercovici has made groundbreaking and lasting contributions to many areas of geodynamics, including our understanding of the fundamental processes that promote plate tectonics on Earth, the mechanics that lead to intraplate volcanism, the storage of volatiles in the Earth's mantle, planet-scale convection processes, and more recently, strategies for long-term carbon storage in the crust. What sets him apart is his keen ability to distill important geophysical processes down to the essential physics that control the behaviour he is investigating – and his insight into how to frame and scale the problems to provide practical and innovative solutions to long-standing geodynamic problems.

OSPP: Outstanding Student and PhD candidate Presentation contest

What is evaluated?

- scientific content (relevance, methods, ...)
- presentation (organization, aesthetic appeal, ability to answer questions, ...)

Who votes?

- 3 pre-defined judges per participating presentation
- ALL EGU participants (from post-doc level on, not co-author, no shared affiliation) can vote as well on abstract page!
- WE NEED YOU!!!

Who can participate?

- first and presenting author
- either currently a BSc or MSc student or PhD candidate
- or last degree obtained in year of GA

Why participate?

- Better visibility for your research
- Award certificate and ceremony
- Free open-access publication in one of the EGU journals
- Conference fee waiver for next EGL







Outstanding Student and PhD candidate Presentation (OSPP) Award

Eligible for the **OSPP Award** are students that:

- are first author and personally present the poster at the conference AND
- satisfy one of the following criteria:
 - o are a current BSc, MSc, or PhD student OR
 - are a <u>recent undergraduate or postgraduate student</u> (conferral of degree after 1
 January of the year preceding the conference) who are presenting their thesis work.

This year (EGU 2022):

- 59 participants in GD (30% increase)
- 101 evaluators




EGU22: Registration numbers and breakdown


