



Mostly shorter than in 2015, especially for OSD with author formatting. Fast compared with most journals depends on authors!

Selection procedure

- Online procedure: during abstract submission (i) indicate participation in OSPP, (ii) indicate if you are available as poster judge
- Conveners select online poster judges (after contacting them, if they are available at the particular day of the poster session; 3 judges per poster)
- Conveners can select from the list of judges or include (after consultation) additional judges
- Evaluations are delivered online at personal OSPP judge dashboard
- OS Division finally select the winning poster(s) or PICO(s)
- There must be at least two reviews to further evaluate the poster/PICO!!!

Prize for the winner

- invitation at EGU GA in 2018 (no registration fees)
- publication of related paper in EGU journal is free of charge

- Thanks to all conveners for the great job and the very good interaction 5 Early Career Scientist's Travel Awards for OS scientists (6 in 2016) Statistics:
 - OS in total : 1629 abstracts in 46 sessions (1138/40 in 2016) 468 Orals (29%); 1142 Posters (70%); 19 PICO (1%)
 - OS lead : 726 abstracts in 19 sessions (465/15 in 2016)
 - EGU in total : 17,399 abstracts (16,130 in 2016; 14,231 in 2015) 4,849 Orals (28%); 11,312 Posters (65%); 1238 PICO (7%)



Papers in programme 2005–2017






