




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

A little longer than in 2014 for OSD, shorter for OS. Fast compared with most journals depends on authors!

Impact factor 2014: 2.232 (2013: 1.962, 2012: 2.192)

Profit (K euros): 2015, -10; 2014, + 5; 2013, - 5

APCs/page charges from 2016 only for OS: €75/page

EGUTOR OSD papers downgraded by removing volume and sequential page numbers Now formatted by authors (hence no APCs until OS)

Special Issues

» Suggestions welcome

Please anyway consider OS for your papers Process is fast, efficient; APCs relatively small The trend is to open access publishing like this EC will pay for continuing FP7 projects, negotiating for H2020

Selection procedure (2015)

- Online procedure: during abstract submission (i) indicate participation in OSPP, (ii) indicate if you are available as poster judge
- Conveners select online poster judges (after contacting them, if they are available at the particular day of the poster session; 3 judges per poster)
- Conveners can select from the list of judges or include (after consultation) additional judges
- Evaluations are delivered online at personal OSPP judge dashboard
- OS Division finally select the winning poster(s) or PICO(s)
- There must be at least two reviews to further evaluate the poster/PICO!!!

Prize for the winner

- invitation at EGU GA in 2016 (no registration fees)
- publication of related paper in EGU journal is free of charge



Papers in programme 2005–2016






