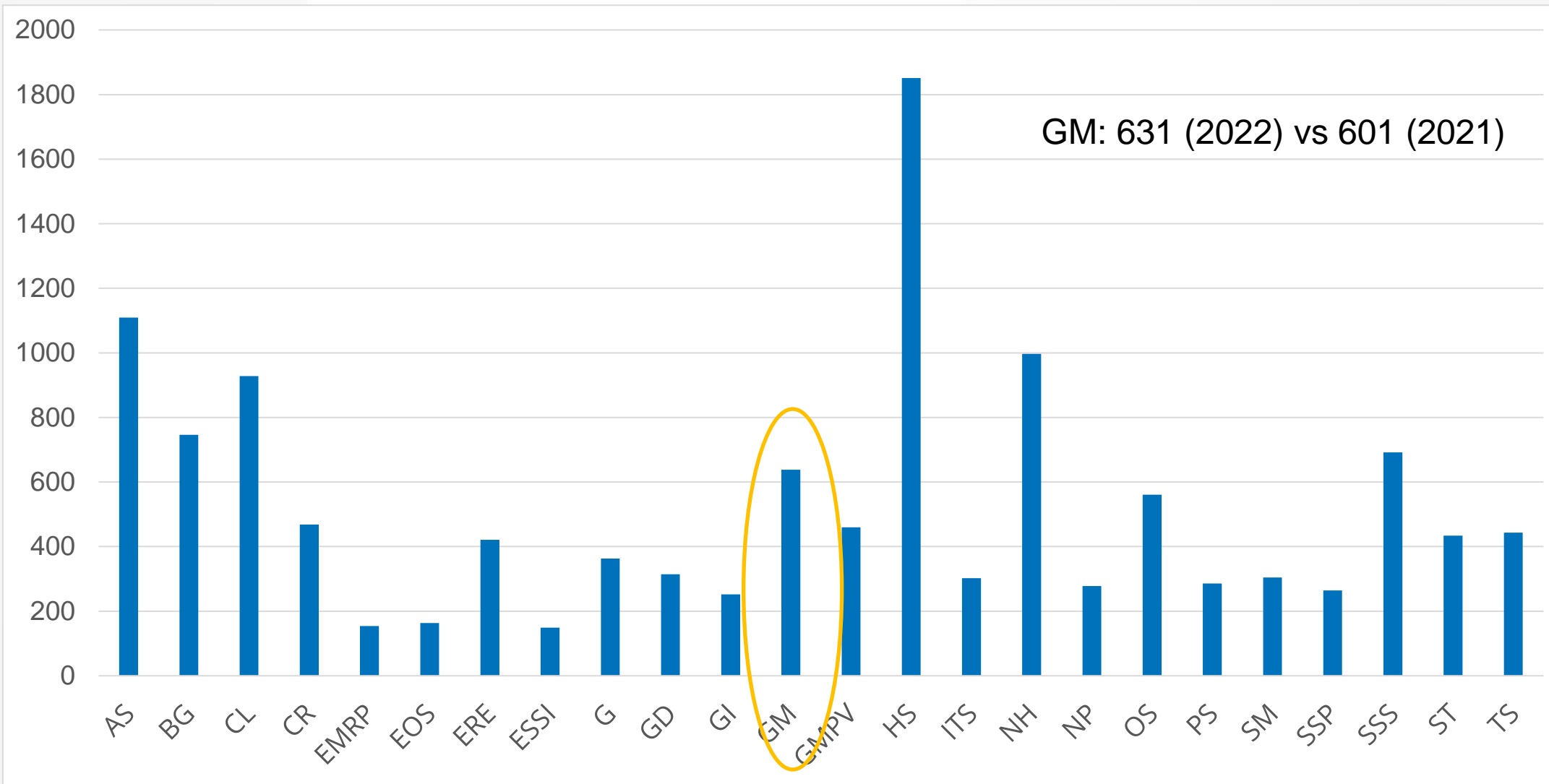

EGU Best practices:

- Minimum three additional members, preferably past medallists, but at least one member who is not a past medallist. These shall also be approved by the division meeting. Term is one year and can be renewed three times.
- Division president is ex-officio member.
- Chair of the Union Awards Committee is ex-officio member.

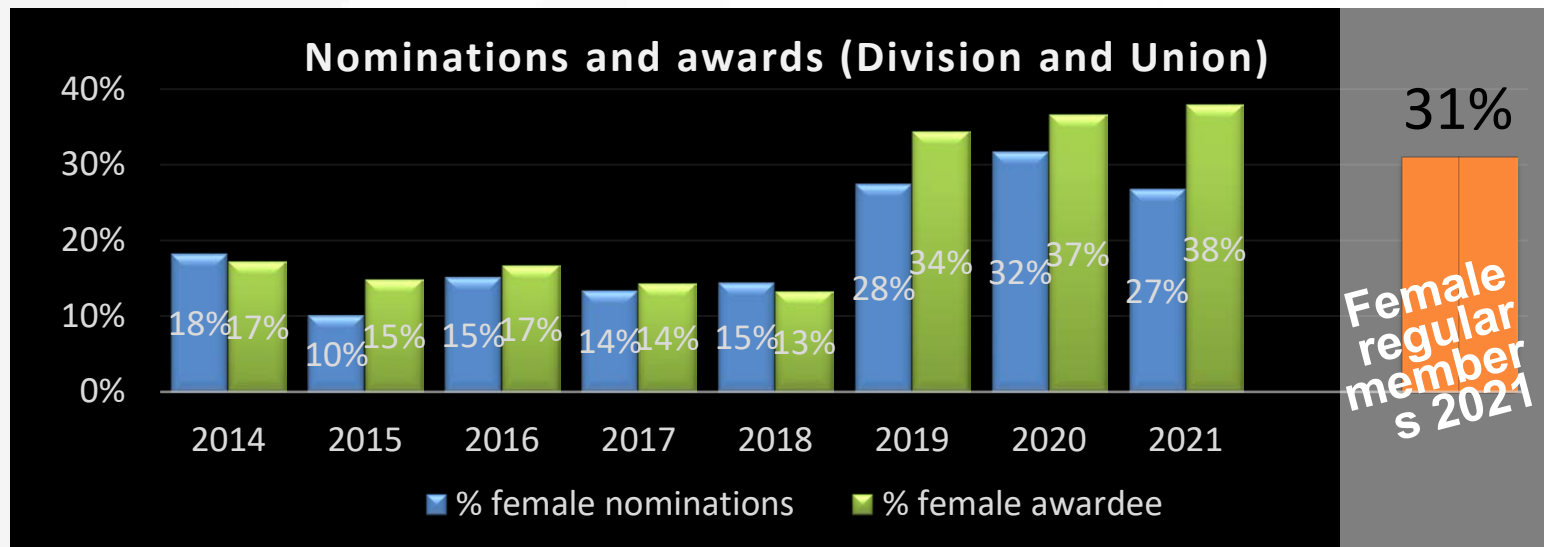

In particular, the governance review will:

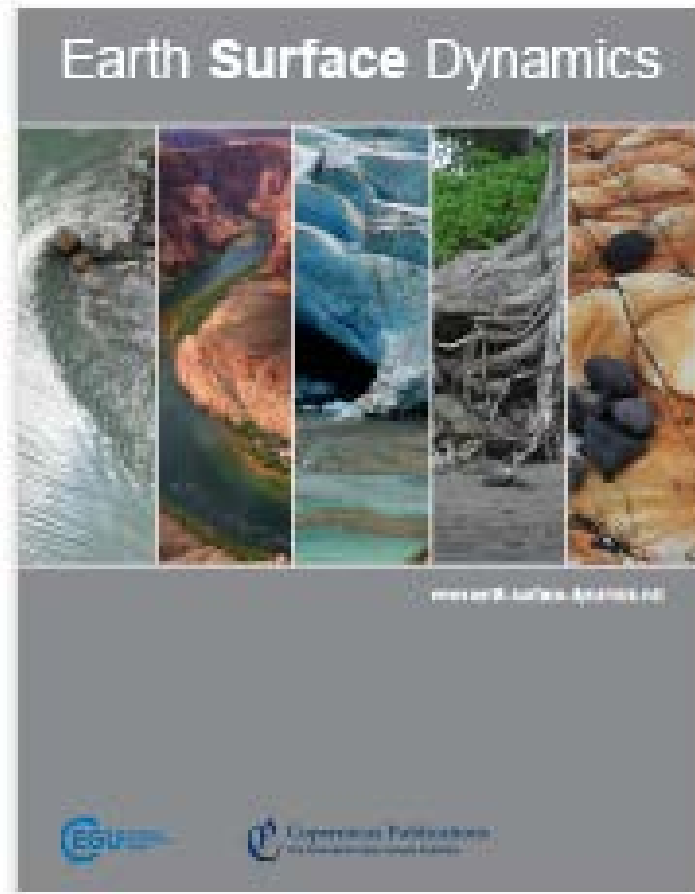
- determine whether the governance processes and structures of the EGU are fit for purpose
- make recommendations for any changes to better serve the current and future needs of the EGU and its members

Objectives of the EGU Governance Review

To review the governance processes and structures of the EGU, and make recommendations for any changes to enable the organisation:

- to best deliver its [Mission and Vision](#)
- to best serve the current and future needs of the organisation and its members;
- to ensure EGU structures deliver appropriate scientific and professional diversity and representation amongst EGU committees and boards

Terms of Reference: The full EGU Governance Review Terms of Reference [is available to download here](#)



- » 2021 saw a minor decrease in submissions, but continued rise in papers published
- » ~20% papers rejected BEFORE published at preprint/discussion stage
- » 0% rejection post preprint phase. Indicating initial sift working well.
- » Now accepting technical development papers
 - Focusing on significant technical, methodological, or model developments in the ESurf subject areas

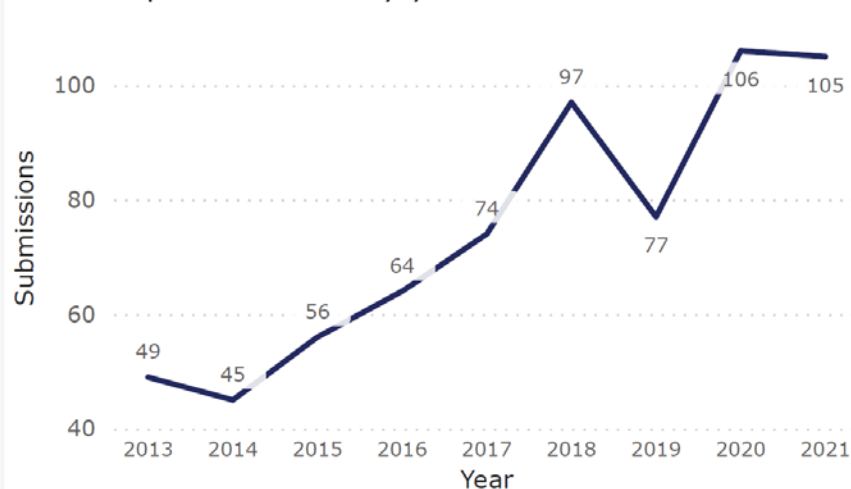

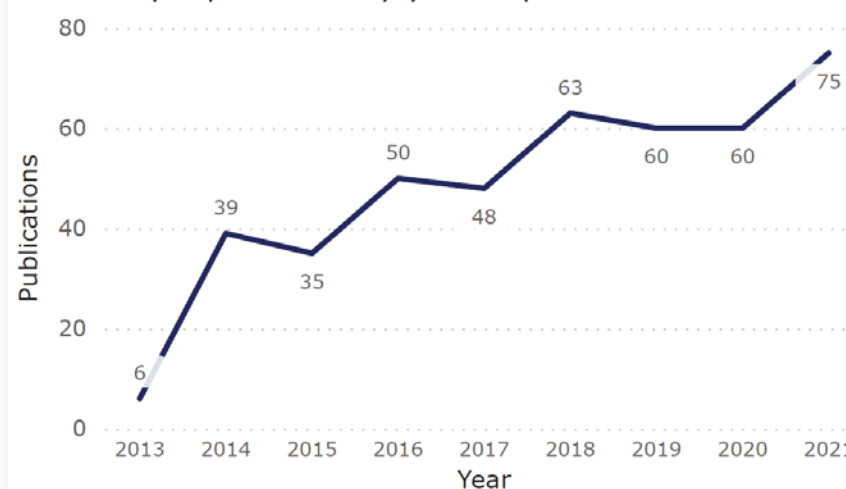

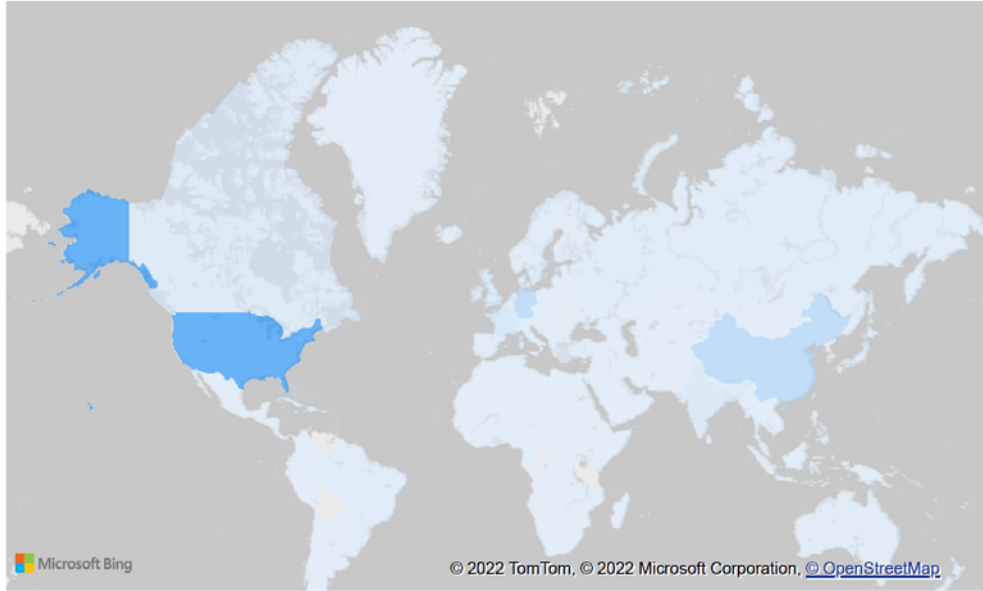

Manuscripts published by year of publication



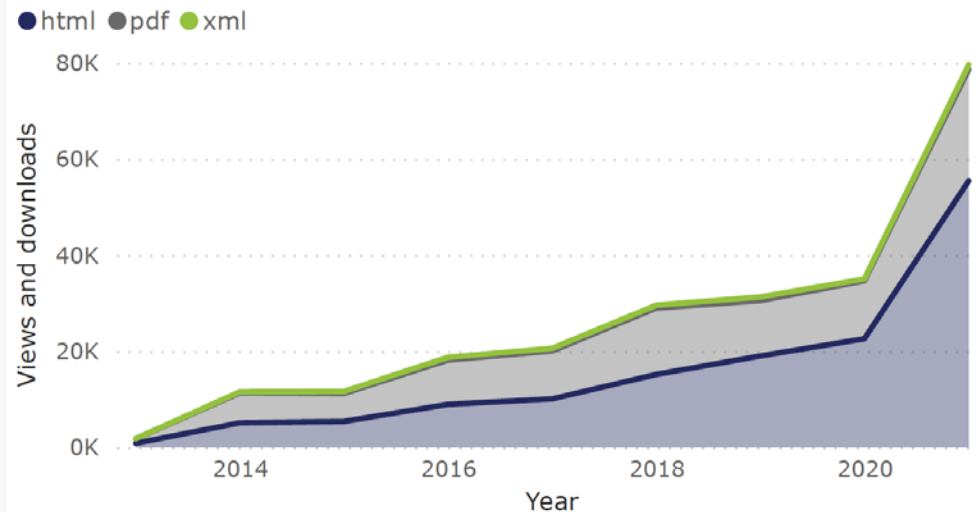

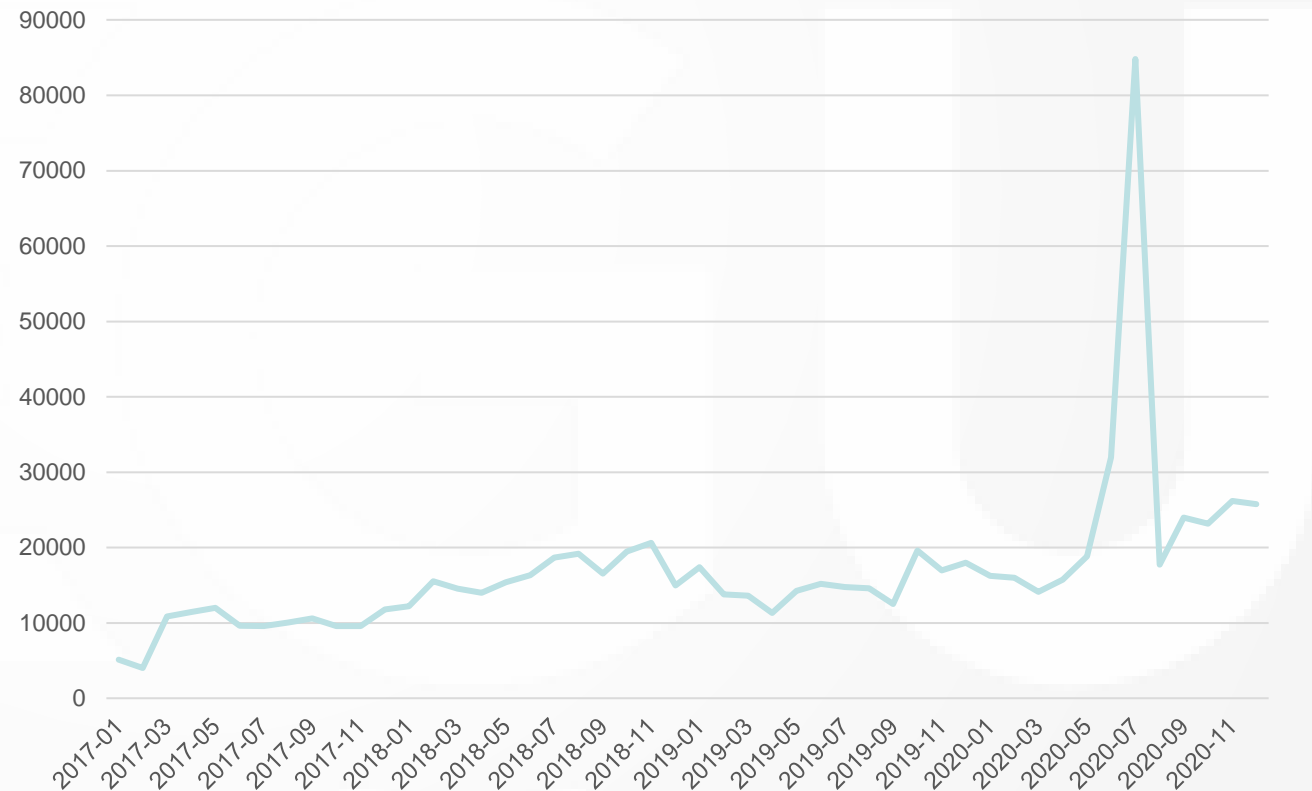
