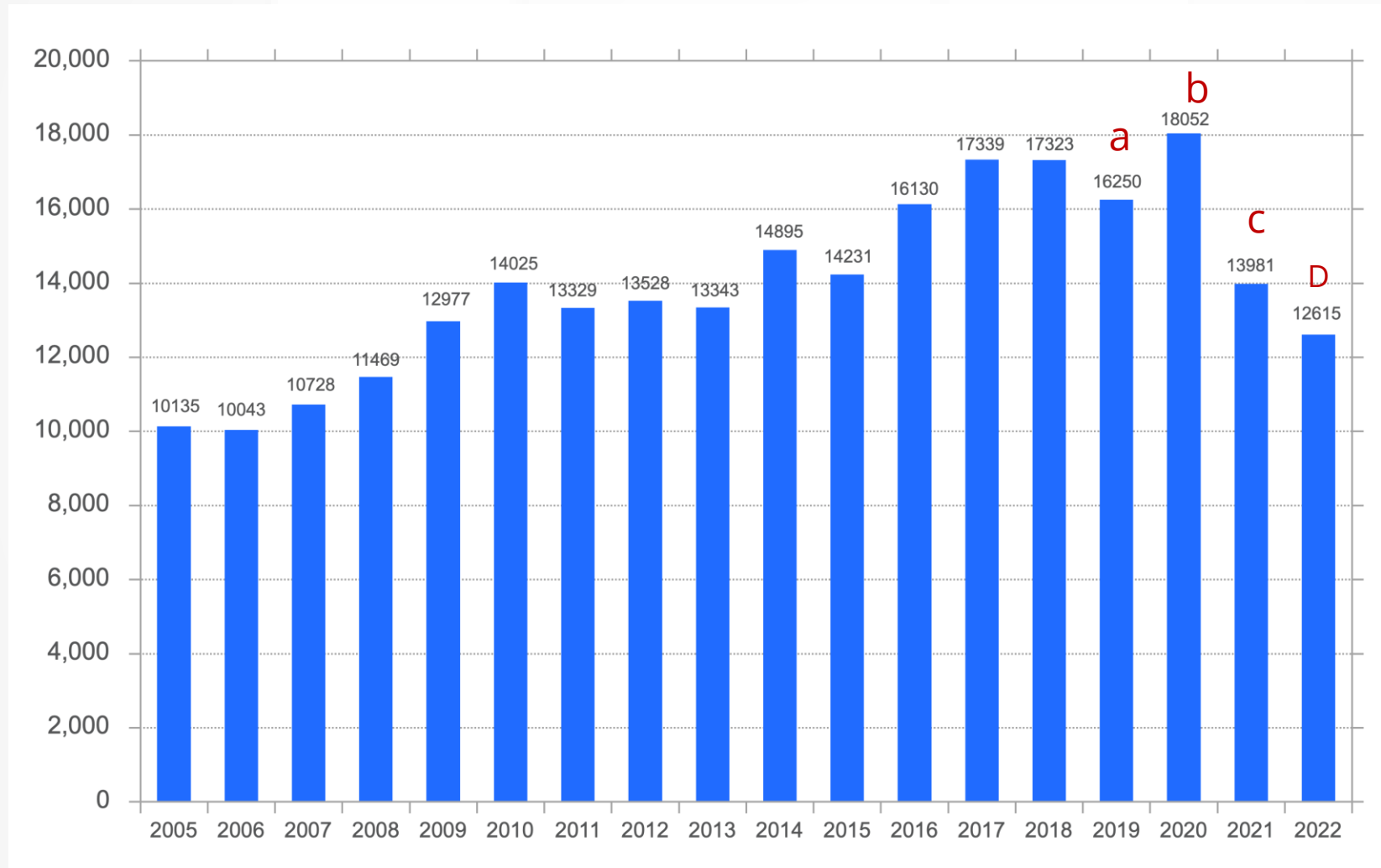

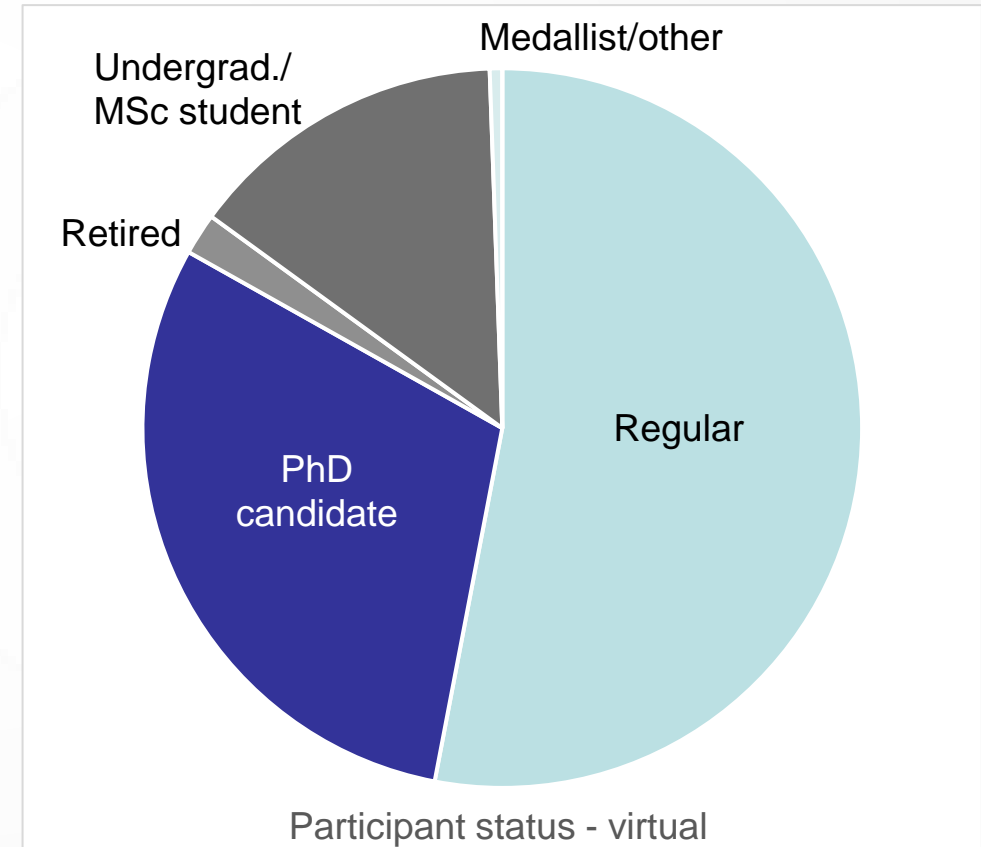
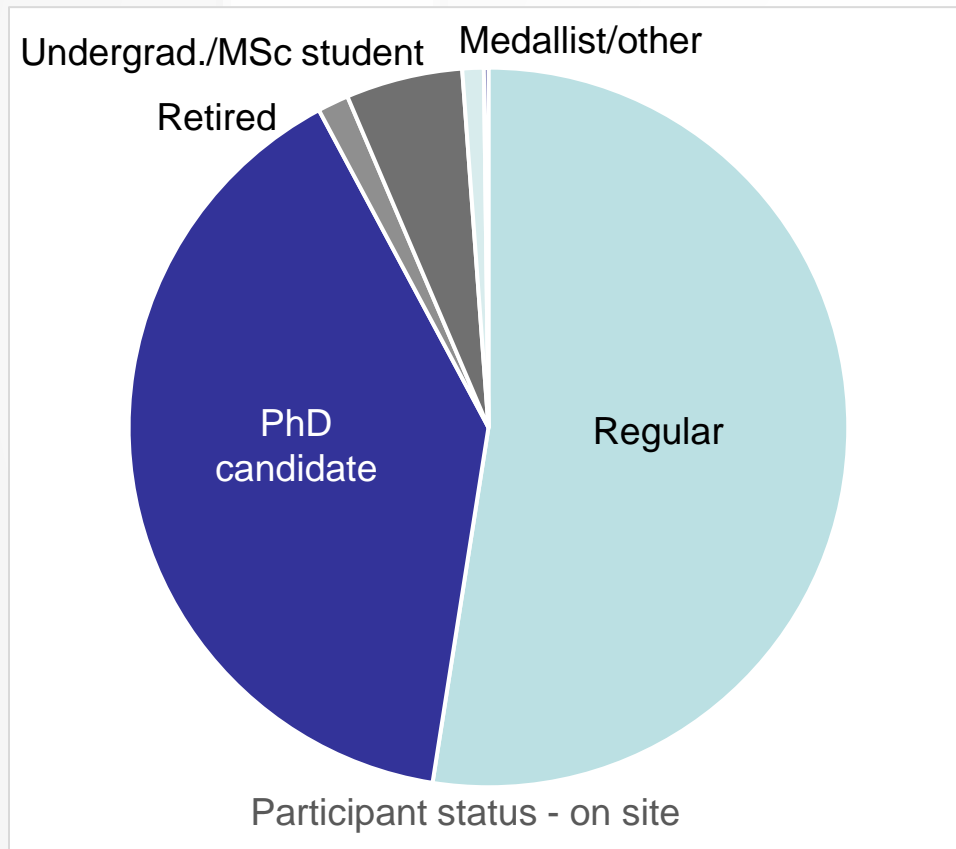

- 2021 (virtual): 1084 abstracts ↓, 57 sessions
CR org: 531 abstracts in 25 sessions → -12%
30 vPICO blocks: **15-20 Abstracts/block**
- 2020 (virtual): 1230 abstracts ↑, 38 sessions
CR org: 603 abstracts in 23 sessions → +46%
25 oral blocks + 6 PICOs : **24 Abstracts/oral block**

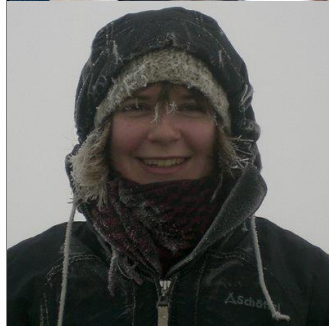
- ECS = 56% of Cryosphere Division

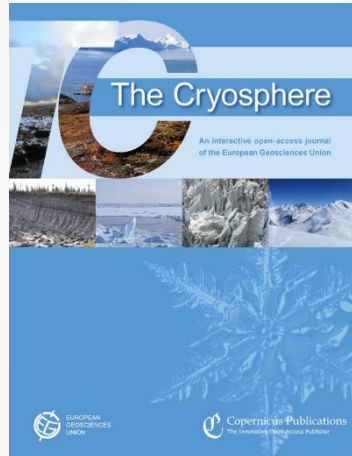

- Open access – IF₂₀₂₁ 5.8



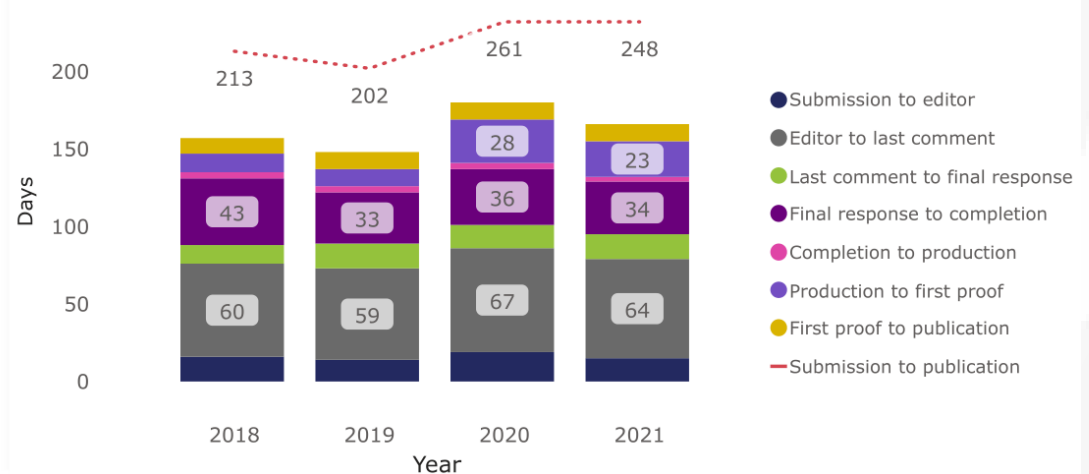
Average time from submission to publication: 248 days.

First review round: 64 days.

New editors needed!

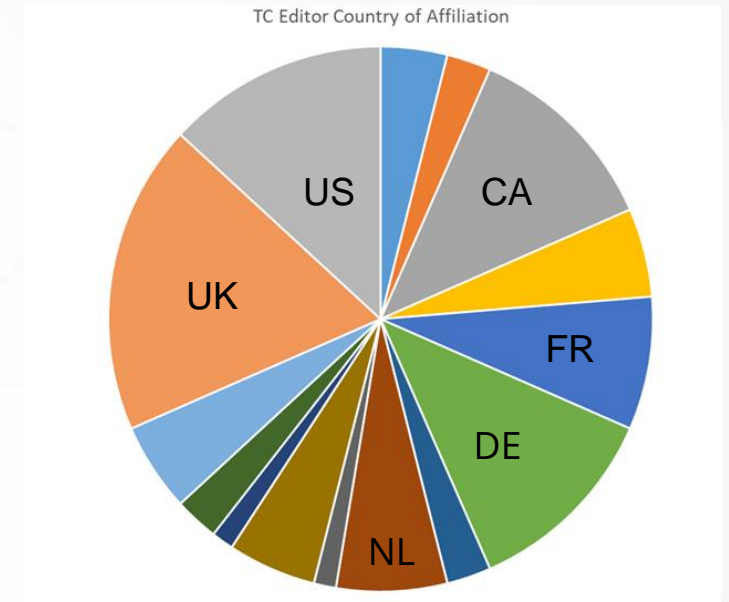
Workload: 6 manuscripts per year. We ask for
