CR Statistics

- 2011: 454 abstracts and 23 oral blocks
- 2010: 387 abstracts and 19 oral blocks.
- About 20% increase between 2010 and 2011
- •(3% increase between 2009 and 2010)
- •For the first time we are filling more than one lecture room for the whole week.
- •Over the last two years number sessions has stayed (almost) the same.
- In total 13,329 abstract submission to EGU 2011, a slight decrease from the 14,809 abstracts submitted in 2010.

Division Outstanding Young Scientists Award



The Division Outstanding Young Scientist Award is given to Thomas Mölg for his fundamental contribution to the study of surface-mass balance processes on tropical glaciers, and for furthering our understanding of the links between tropical glaciers and global climate.





Luis Agassiz Medal 2011



The Louis Agassiz Medal is awarded to Julian A. Dowdeswell for outstanding contributions to the study of polar ice masses and to the understanding of the processes and patterns of sedimentation in glacier-influenced marine environments.

Matthias Huss

for the poster entitled:

Large scatter and multidecadal fluctuations in the 20th century mass loss of 30 Alpine glaciers by Matthias Huss, Regine Hock, Andreas Bauder, and Martin Funk

Matthias Huss is a postdoc at the University of Fribourg, Switzerland, and has recently finished his PhD at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology. The focus of his thesis was on glacier mass loss in the Swiss Alps over the last century and on models for calculating impacts of future glacier retreat.

The Cryosphere



•Open access journal

•ISI listed (impact factor expected sometime early this year).

•In 2010: 51 papers in TC, 118 papers in TCD 269% overall growth.

•On average 13 days between submission to publication in TCD (median 9 days).

`Open access' is the future of scientific publishing!!!
