

Intervals are disappointing, all longer than in 2012. However, fast compared with most journals and depend on authors!

Impact factor 2012: 2.192 (2011: 2.293; 2010: 1.443)

Profit: 2013, - 5Keuro (2012, +15Keuro) – OK Page charges stay same for 2014

- OS in total : 843 abstracts in 26 sessions (857/28 in 2013) 261 Orals (31%) - 582 Posters (69%) - 0 PICO (0%)
- OS Co-organized : 310 abstracts in 11 sessions (257/11 in 2013)
- EGU in total : 15,059 abstracts (13,343 in 2013; 13,965 in 2012) 4,684 Orals (35%) - 8,207 Posters (62%) - 452 PICO (3%)
