




- 1. EGU24 hybrid format

How to get involved and become an active member of the NH division team:

Conveners: Propose and organise sessions via the EGU website (Oral/poster or PICO; short courses, Union Symposia, Great Debates, Townhall meetings), deadline usually in September

Authors: Submit your exciting results and studies to the suggested sessions, deadline normally beginning of January

For information during the year – subscribe to the NH mailing list



NH Division team

How to get involved and become an active member of the NH division team:

President: EGU-wide elections every two years, preceded by a call for candidates, candidates must be approved by the EGU Council, two terms possible i.e. max 4 years

Deputy President: 1) Incoming and outgoing Presidents are Deputy Presidents for one year to ensure a smooth handover, 2) In the intervening period the President nominates a Vice-President to assist with all duties, subject to approval by the NH Community at the Divisional Meeting

Science/Policy officers: Division internal selection process, call for candidates via the NH mailing list (nh@lists.egu.eu), election by the NH team (>30 people), term is 2 years, 2 terms are possible (without election) i.e. max 4 years, subject to approval by the NH community during the Division meeting



NH Division team

How to get involved and become an active member of the NH division team:

ECS representatives: ECS team internal selection process, term is 2 years, 2 terms are possible i.e. max 4 years, subject to approval of NH community during division meeting

ECS award committee: members are nominated by the NH president (usually past awardees), important is a good representation of NH disciplines, term is 2 years, 2 terms are possible i.e. max 4 years, subject to approval of NH community during division meeting


Medal committees: members are nominated by the NH president and the chair of the Union Awards Committee (currently Thomas Blunier), usually past medalists, important is a good representation of NH disciplines, approval of NH community during division meeting, approval by the EGU council



- * An exception is one award to promote excellence in journalism allowing nominations from non-members and self nominations
- ** plus one medals each for journalism, outreach and service to the union





Plinius medal 2023

- This medal was established by the Natural Hazards Division to recognise interdisciplinary natural-hazard research. The name of Gaius Plinius Secundus (~23 – 79 A.D.) acknowledges the role of our ancestors working to improve both knowledge and mitigation of natural hazards. From 2002–2003 (EGS) and 2004–2011 (EGU) it was awarded to early career scientists. Since 2012 the medal recognises interdisciplinary research in natural hazards by outstanding scientists who meet the following criteria: outstanding research achievements in fields related with natural hazards, important interdisciplinary activity in two or more fields related with this topic, and research that has been applied in the mitigation of risks from natural hazards.
- Important: the medal welcomes candidates of all career stages





Sergey Soloviev medal 2023

- This medal was established by the Natural Hazards Division in recognition of the scientific achievements of Sergey Soloviev. It is awarded for outstanding scientific contributions in fundamental research that improves our knowledge of basic natural hazards principles, as well as research that assesses and leads to the proper mitigation of natural hazards, from both human and environmental perspectives.












Processing times (days median) by year of journal publication
