EGU23 - Updates from the EGU Programme Committee

- **EGU Programme Committee** now has **two PC Co-chairs**, appointed by the EGU Council for the planning of the General Assemblies 2023 & 2024. They are supported by the **Events** Co-Ordinator, an EGU office staff member
- **The Programme Committee** is comprised of **General Positions** (Executive Board, Conference Organizer, PC Co-chairs), and **Programme Group Chairs** (22 EGU Divisions with their science officers + SC, ITS, EOS)
- **Our goal:** to transition to a stable fully **hybrid** format of the General Assembly, taking into consideration **inclusivity** and **sustainability** wherever possible and responding to the main **scientific challenges of geosciences worldwide**

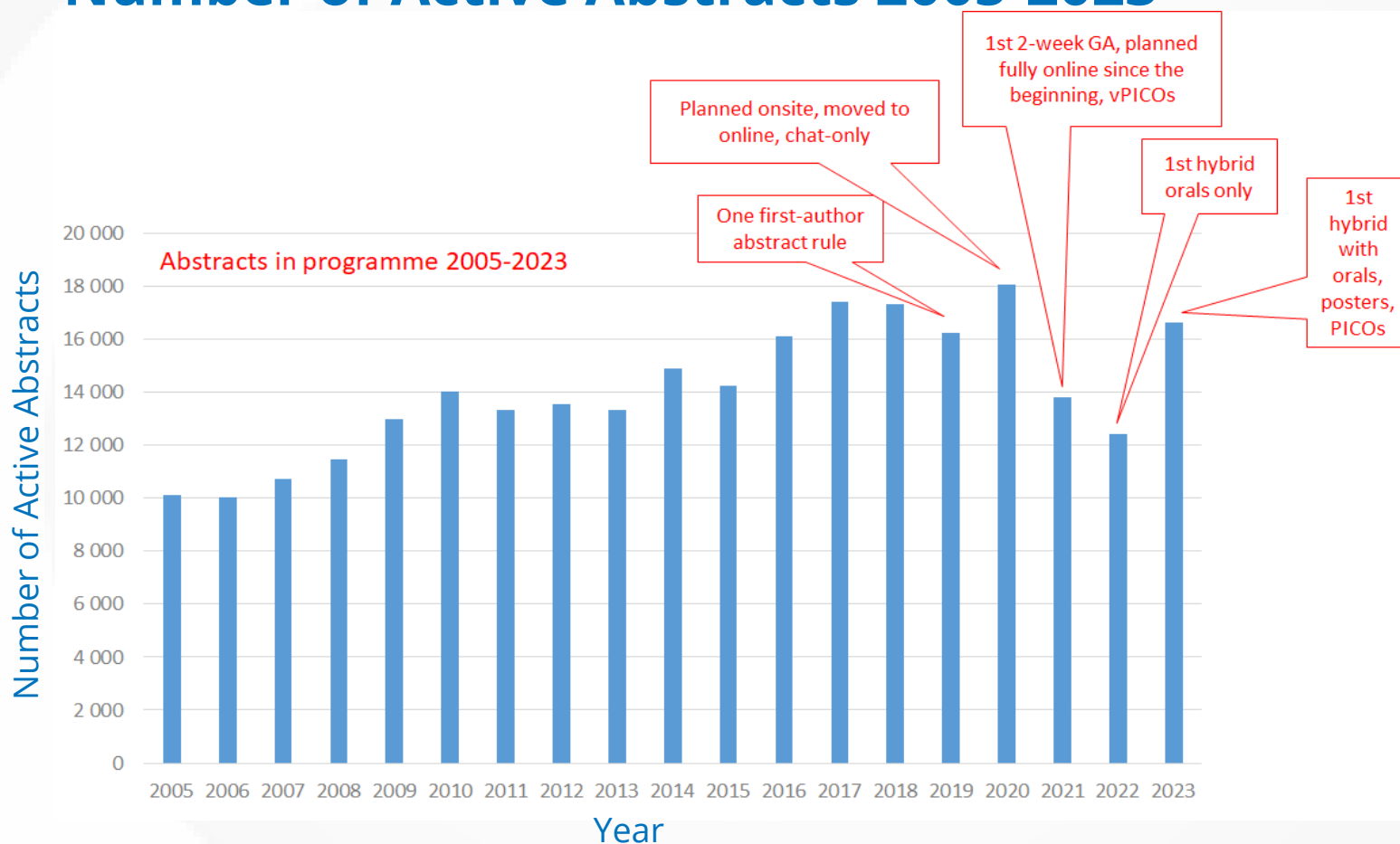

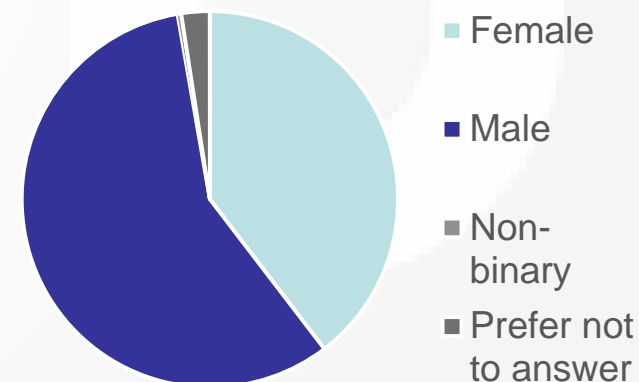

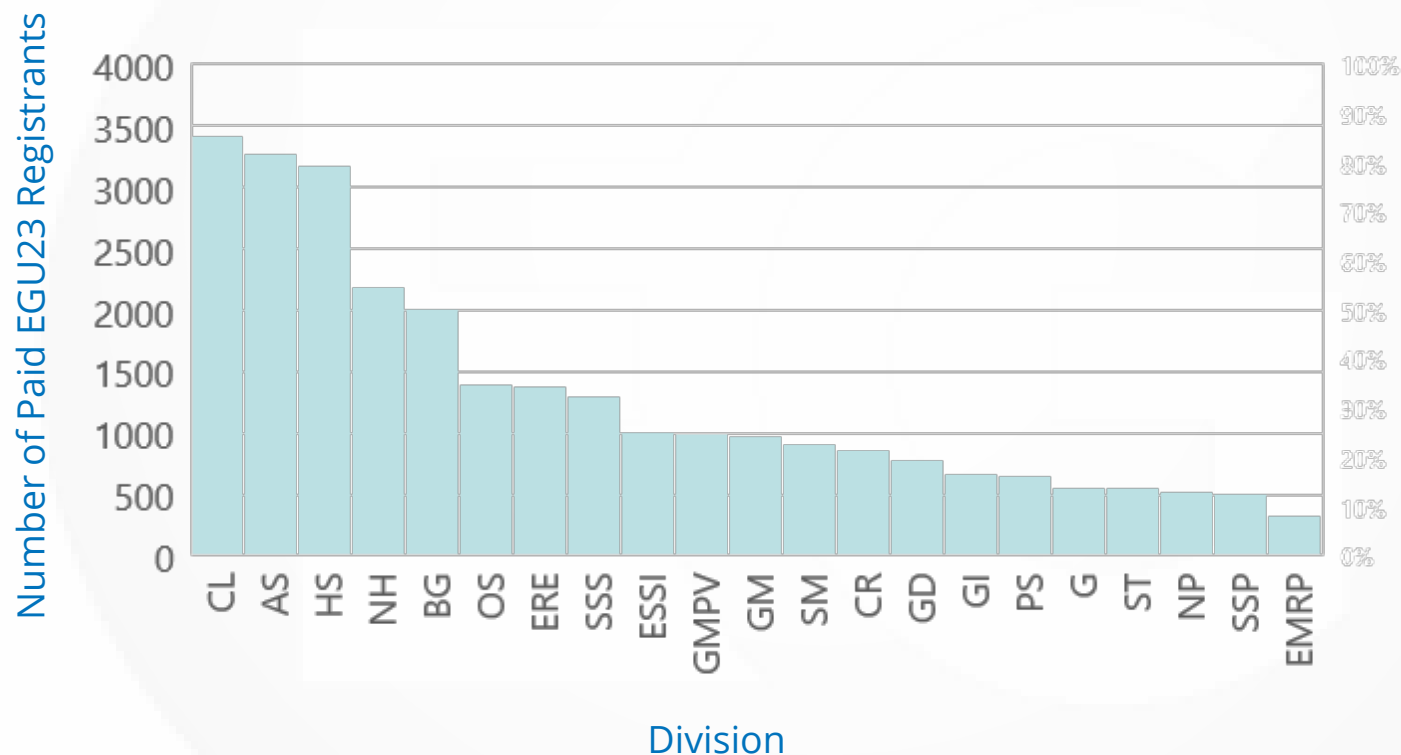
EGU23 Registration Statistics (as of 17 Apr)

- 16,604 **active scheduled abstracts**
- 15,319 **total registrations** (13,287 on-site / 2,032 virtual)
- ~13% of total participants registered for **virtual participation**
- ~ 40% of total participants are **PhD candidates, Master or Undergraduate students** (~ 25% participating virtually)
- ~ 5% of registered participants from **low- & lower-middle income countries** (approx. equally distributed onsite & virtual participation)
- **Gender:** male (~ 57 %) and female (~ 39 %), with less difference between percentages for virtual participation

(note: a participant can choose more than one division of affiliation)



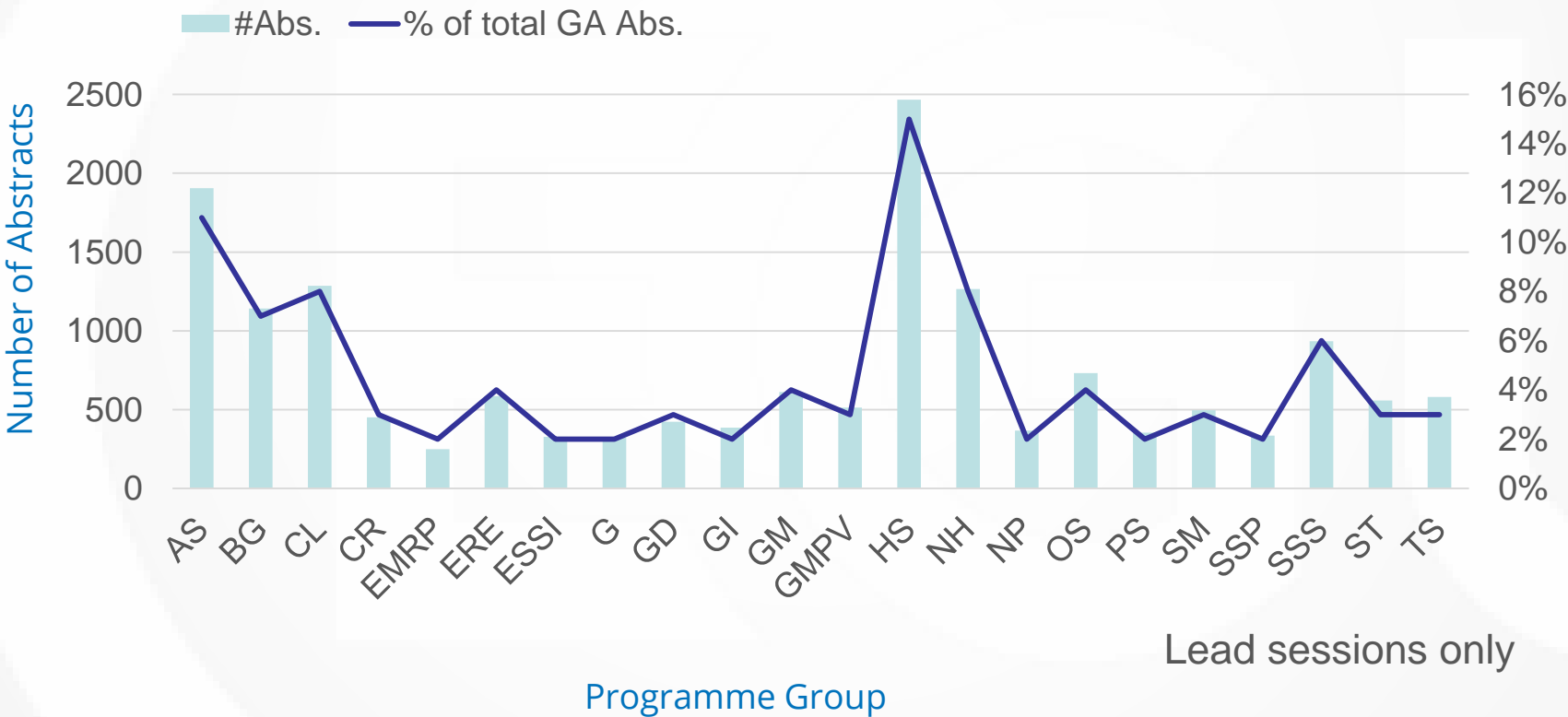

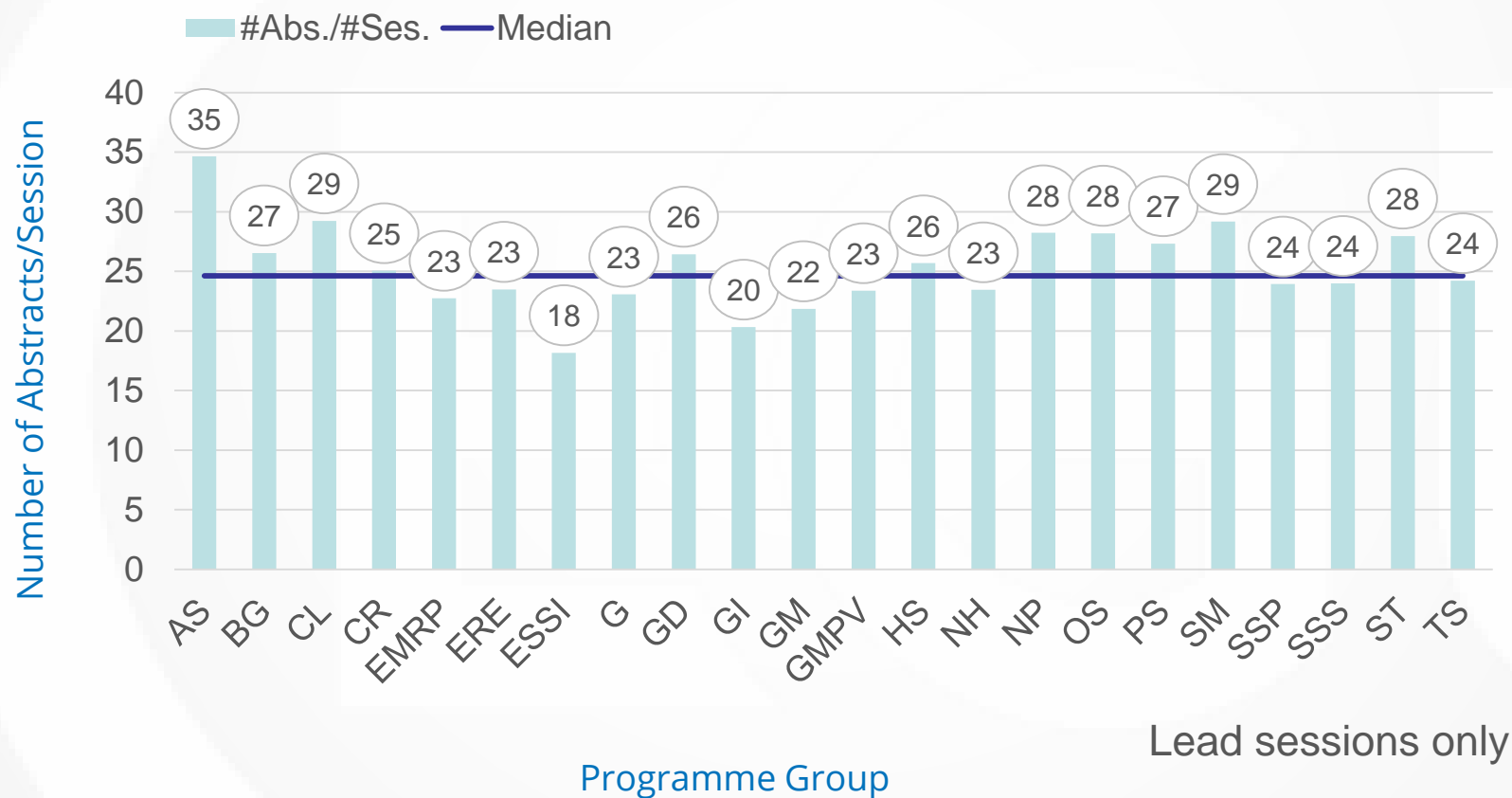

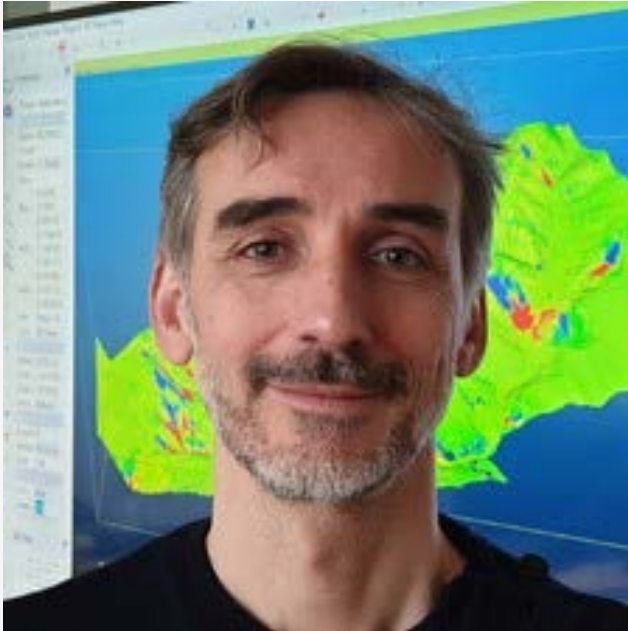
Arne Richter Award for Outstanding Early Career Scientists 2023

The 2023 Arne Richter Award for Outstanding Early Career Scientists is awarded to Tjalling de Haas in recognition of their fundamental contributions to advancing the understanding of landslide-tsunami interactions and of mass flows more broadly on Earth and Mars, using a suite of innovative approaches.

The 2023 Ralph Alger Bagnold Medal is awarded to Dimitri Lague for impactful research in quantifying landscapes and their dynamics through a suite of innovative approaches, including new technologies and techniques, alongside outstanding leadership in open science.

Ralph Alger Bagnold medal committee

EGU Best practices:

- Each division medal chair nomination is discussed at division meeting and appointed by the Council. Term is one year and can be renewed three times.
- Minimum three additional members, preferably past medallists, but at least one member who is not a past medallist. These shall also be approved by the division meeting. Term is one year and can be renewed three times.
- Division president is ex-officio member.
- Chair of the Union Awards Committee is ex-officio member.

Bagnold Medal Criteria Update

» New Text

- » This medal was established by the Geomorphology Division in commemoration of the scientific achievements of [Ralph Alger Bagnold](#). It is awarded annually to individuals in recognition of their outstanding contributions to the study of geomorphology, by means of a sustained contribution to a particular research area, the originality, timeliness and significance of their research ***and the broader community service contributions and leadership of the discipline.***

» Old Text

- » This medal was established by the Geomorphology Division in commemoration of the scientific achievements of Ralph Alger Bagnold. It is awarded to individuals in recognition of their outstanding scientific contributions to the study of geomorphology, by means of: a substantive recent contribution to a particular research area, the originality and innovative nature of the research, and timeliness and significance of the research.



- » EGU features an extensive awards and medals programme on all career stages
- » Nominations are exclusively by EGU members* while candidates do not need to be EGU members. (*An exception is one award to promote excellence in journalism allowing nominations from non-members and self nominations)
- » Individual award and medal committees are then evaluating the nominations selecting the most deserving candidate based on scientific achievements**. (**plus one medals each for journalism, outreach and service to the union)

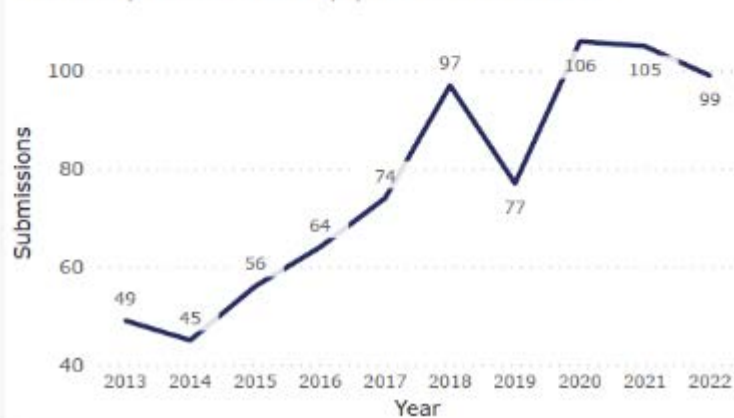

Manuscripts published by year of publication

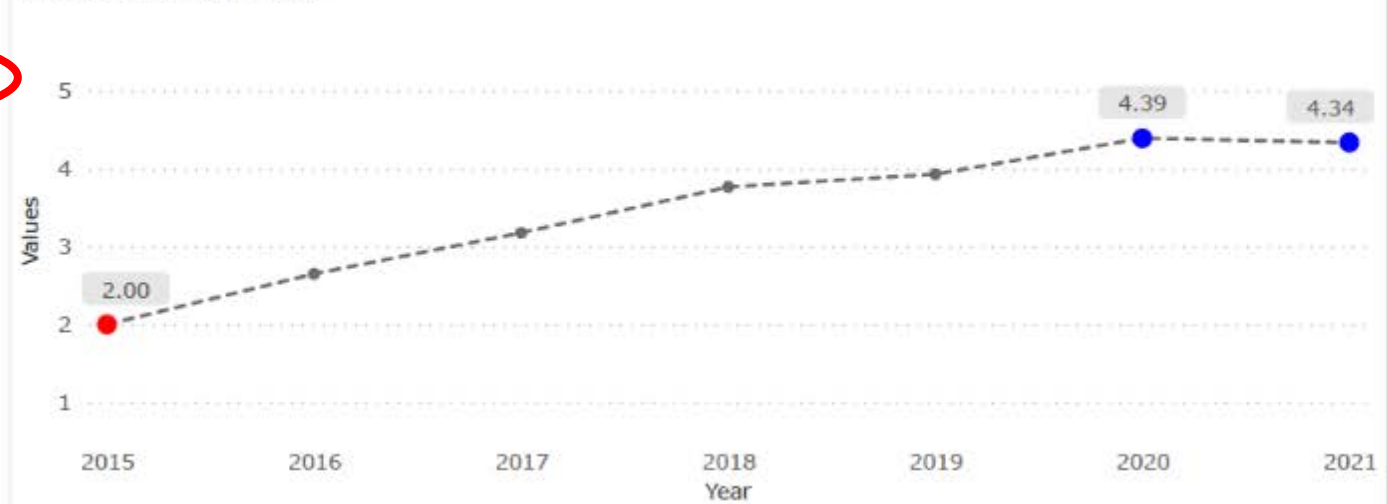

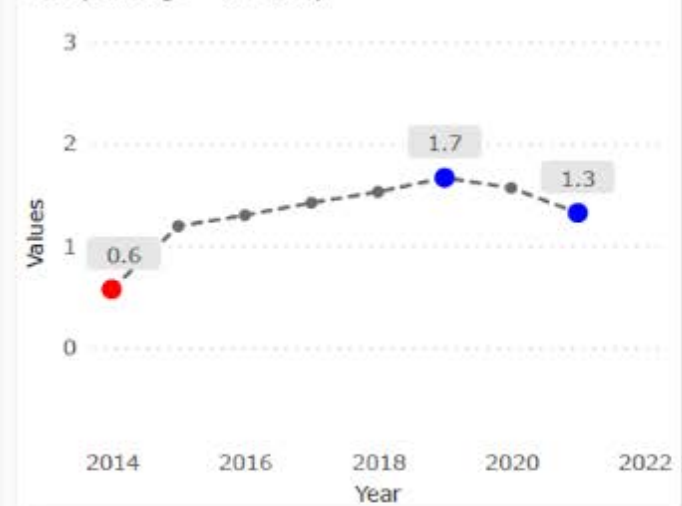

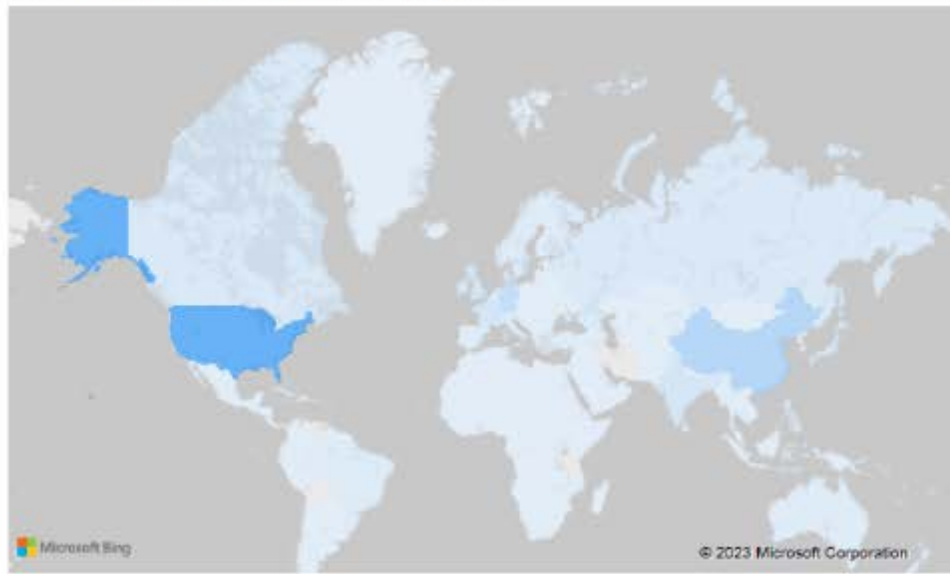

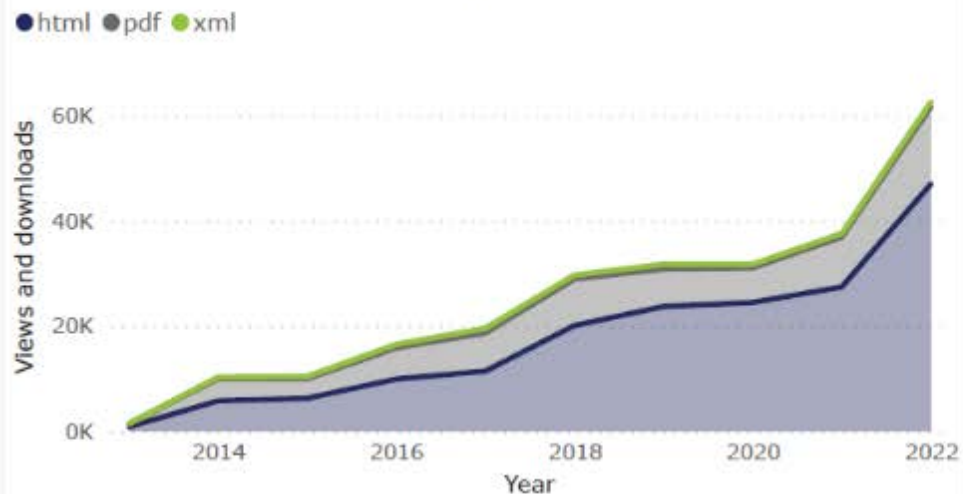

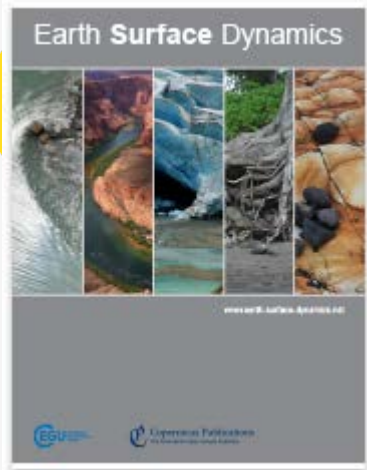
News and requests for GM community (1)

- » ESurf admissions will all be via EGUSphere
 - EGUSphere is the EGU Pre-Print server
- » Presently two options
 - Via ESurf route
 - Via EGUSphere
- » This can lead to confusion – especially with different labelling of manuscripts from Esurf/EGUSphere
- » Papers submitted via EGUSphere are reviewed and treated identically to Esurf submissions
- » Single path is simpler

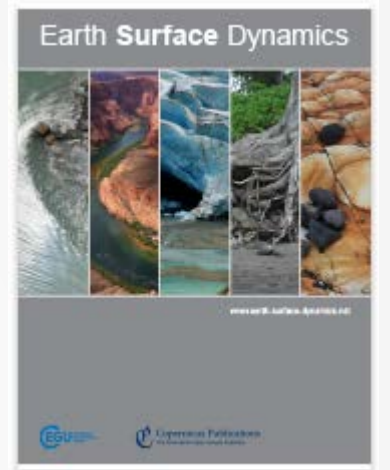

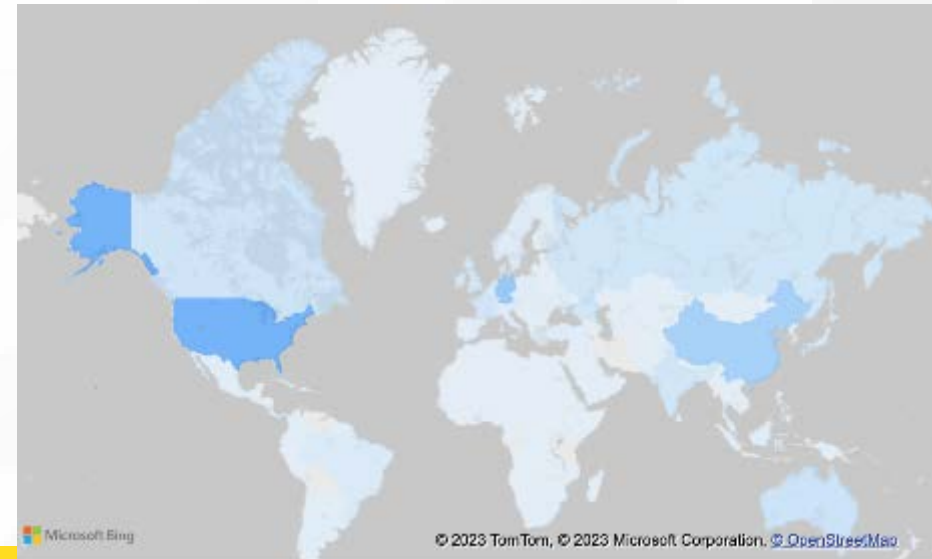

Brief History of the IAG

The IAG/AIG was founded at the Second International Conference on Geomorphology in Frankfurt/Main (Germany) in 1989 in order to strengthen international geomorphology.

The original Constitution of the International Association of Geomorphologists was officially approved by the IAG General Assembly in Tokyo (2001) as well is formal approval by the International Geographical Union (IGU) and International Union of Geological Sciences (IUGS).

It is replaced by the new constitution approved in 2019 at IAG General Assembly at the Athens Regional Conference on Geomorphology.

The legal status of the IAG

On March 4th, 2019 IAG was recognized as an international non-profit organization, with a registered office in Madrid (Spain).

Presently we have **63 countries**

Objectives of the IAG

- a) to develop Geomorphology through international cooperation**
- b) to promote the dissemination of geomorphological knowledge between the scientific community and the general public**
- c) to provide geomorphological advice to international institutions**
- d) to encourage the membership of countries around the world, incorporating the different national delegations of each country**
- e) to promote geomorphological research and the establishment of working groups on specific geomorphological topics**
- f) to support the training of geomorphologists at an early career stage from all around the world, and especially those from economically disadvantaged countries.**

IAG Working Groups

The International Association of Geomorphologists (IAG) had started to support the Working Groups from 1997 (Bologna EC Meeting, Italy). Since then, altogether 38 Working Groups have been supported. 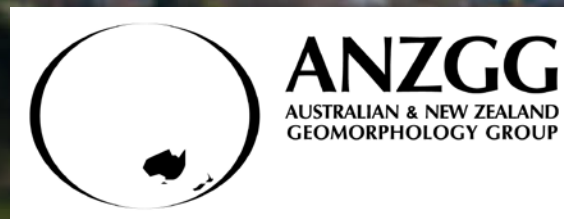

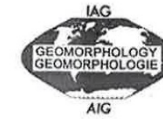




Memoranda of Understanding

The Geomorphology Division of the European Geosciences Union (EGU) and the International Association of Geomorphologists (IAG / AIG) recognise that a closer relationship between the two organisations can foster international exchange in geomorphological research and learning and promote international opportunities in geomorphology for members of both organisations. To that effect the organisations will promote the following activities:

- an exchange of information and possible joint activities concerning educational opportunities, student programs, and professional services; and

In recognition of the mutual interests among their members and as a means of furthering the common goals and objectives of both organisations, the collaborations are carried out under the following terms:

- Neither organisation shall have any financial obligation to the other
- Both organisations will seek collaboration where appropriate
- The respective leadership will meet on a regular basis to discuss issues of mutual interest.

The agreement is intended to help further the goals and objectives of both organizations through collaboration and to advance Geomorphology in every aspect.

This agreement may be dissolved by either organisation at any time with 30 days notice.
