

Statistics:

OS in total : 857 abstracts in 28 sessions (757/24 in 2012)

295 Orals (34%) - 531 Posters (62%) - 31 PICO (4%)

OS Co-organised : 257 abstracts in 11 sessions (249/8 in 2012)

EGU in total : 13,343 abstracts (13,965 in 2012 - 13,340 in 2011)

4,684 Orals (35%) - 8,207 Posters (62%) - 452 PICO (3%)
