### European Geosciences Union Natural Hazards Division

Business Meeting Minutes 12.15-13.15, 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2009 Vienna International Conference Centre, Room 29

Chair: Bruce D. Malamud (President, NH Division)
In attendance: about 105 people

- 1. Those present approved the agenda for the meeting.
- 2. The Chair listed the current Scientific Secretaries and highlighted the range of roles that they undertake.
- 3. The Chair awarded the YSOPP prizes to those winners who were present.
- 4. The Chair outlined the statistics of the Natural Hazards Division of the EGU 2009 General Assembly. Of note are the following:
  - a. NH had 61 sessions, of which NH was the lead in 47;
  - b. NH received 1681 abstracts, of which 1304 were for sessions for which NH was the lead;
  - c. 33% of papers were given via oral presentations;
- 5. The Chair raised the issue of reserving time-block 5 (TB5) for poster sessions only and no oral presentations, as was done for the first time at EGU 2009. There was a lively debate followed by a vote. Approximately 45 of those present voted to retain TB5 as poster only, five voted against. Thus the meeting **resolved to reserve TB5 for posters in the EGU General Assembly 2010**.
- 6. The Chair noted the winners of the Plinius and Sergey Soloviev medals and called for nominations for the 2010 awards (nominations due by 31st May 2009).
- 7. The Chair reminded convenors of the need to:
  - a. Highlight items of interest to the media;
  - b. Process requests for financial assistance on time.
- 8. The Chair outlined other NH Division activities over the last year, and those currently planned.
- 9. The Chair highlighted that the Natural Hazards division would soon have a publically accessible web page. This will be managed by the NH Division Vice-President (David Petley).
- 10. The Chair outlined the process of generating the scientific programme for NH at EGU2010. The first step will be to generate a skeleton programme (deadline early June 2009). As the Division President will be acting as Scientific Programme Chair for the whole EGU 2010 General Assembly, the role of programme chair for NH division will be undertaken by Dave Petley.
- 11. A short presentation on the Plinius 2009 meeting was made by the conference coordinator, Dr. Maria-Carmen Llasat. The meeting will be held on 7<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>th</sup> September 2009 in Barcelona, Spain, with registration and abstract submission open in mid-May 2009.


- 12. The Chair, on behalf of Fausto Guzzetti the managing editor of the EGU journal NHESS (*Natural Hazards and Earth Systems Sciences*), briefly outlined current key statistics:
  - a. In 2008 133 papers were published;
  - b. The impact factor has risen from 0.884 (2006) to 1.021 (2007);
  - c. The average cycle is 66 days from submission to an editorial decision and a further 42 days from a decision to appearance online. The number of 42 days has decreased substantially in the last few months and is now about one week.
- 13. The Chair noted the outgoing Scientific Secretaries, Alberto Mugnai, Bruno Merz, and Paola Reichenbach, all of whom were individually thanked by the meeting via rounds of applause;
- 14. The Chair called for nominations for new Scientific Secretaries.
- 15. There was a long and spirited debate on whether or not to combine the Meteorological Hazards and Hydrological Hazards subsections of the Natural Hazards division. The Chair called for a vote; 40 of those present were in favour of the merger; eight were against. Thus, the meeting **resolved to merge the Meteorological Hazards and Hydrological Hazards sections of the NH Division,** but with two Scientific Secretaries if needed, and to be called Hydro-Meteorological Hazards.
- 16. The Chair led a debate on the ways in which Scientific Secretaries are appointed, or other decisions (e.g. medal committees) where appointments might be necessary. The meeting unanimously (30 for, zero against) resolved to empower the Natural Hazards Division President, in conjunction with the scientific secretaries, to make decisions on appointment issues.
- 17.Dr Oded Katz was confirmed as the new Scientific Secretary for Natural Hazards and Society.
- 18. **Dr Giorgio Boni was confirmed as a new Scientific Secretary for Hydro-Meteorological Hazards.** A nomination is required for the second Scientific Secretary in this area, if it is felt necessary to have a second scientific secretary;
- 19. The Chair highlighted the need for sessions to be convened by a group that is representative of the wider scientific community, in particular with respect to gender balance.
- 20. The Chair asked all present to send comments about the good and bad aspects of the meeting directly to him.
- 21. The Chair closed the meeting at 13:15.
