


#### **EGU25:** numbers at a glance

- ECS Networking, Science for Policy, and EDI Committee events





- Free open-access publication in one of the EGU journals




Representation of Arctic mixed-phase clouds in the ECMWF Integrated Forecasting System during MOSAiC


Projection of near-surface winds in Antarctica using Earth System Models downscaled by a regional atmospheric model (MAR)




