

ABSTRACT

In this work, we analyse data from the Iovian Infrared Auroral Mapper (IIRAM) imaging spectrometer on board the NASA mission Juno, to investigate the presence of spectrally identifiable ammonia clouds (SIACs). Focusing on the data from the first perijove passage we found that a white vortex structure pear 40 °N provides the best candidate. Implementing atmospheric retrieval thanks to the planetary spectrum generator, we fit the IIRAM spectra (in the 2.5-3.1 µm range) inside and outside the vortex, varying the gaseous ammonia profiles, and the clouds and hazes properties and composition. We found that outside the vortex, the best fit is achieved using main clouds composed of tholins (approximation of an unknown contaminant material). Inside the vortex the best fit is achieved when main cloud decks are composed of pure ammonia ice, or ammonia-coated tholins. 




