As of 14 April, the Assembly 2016 provides:

- 30 papers in programme+13.34% (2015)
- 4,863 orals / 10,320 posters/ 947 PICOs (Ratio 30 / 64 / 6)
- » 619 unique scientific sessions | 321 side events
- » 10,988 registrations in advance (10,943 already paid) | +23.68% (2015)

As of 19 April, the Assembly 2017 provides:

- 17,399 papers in programme+7.87% (2016)
- * 4,849 orals | 11,312 posters |1,238 PICOs | ratio 28 / 65 / 7
- » 649 unique scientific sessions | 88 short courses | 322 side events*
- » 11,331 registrations in advance | +3.55% (2016)





Papers in programme 2005–2017







Presentation ratio 2005–2017










Participants at EGU General Assemblies 2005–2016

ECS Representative Election


- » Candidates (or a nominated proxy) will briefly introduce themselves




Conveners beware!

- » Consequences of transferring abstracts to sessions where the ESSI is not the lead Division Consequences:
 - Positive impacts
 - Good science, better communication, improved integration of ESSI into other divisions
 - Negative impacts
 - Less abstracts in ESSI means less rooms next year and a smaller division.
 - Presenters can end up in sessions on another day and in other rooms isolated from the other ESSI sessions
- » Please try to minimize transfers to other divisions (even if it is coorganized)
- » If you have to merge sessions, try to ensure ESSI is the lead Division

Division President: election

- » Change in procedure
- » Next election now autumn 2017 (closing date 15 September 2017)
- » Successful candidate: deputy president until EGU GA 2019
- » All EGU members are eligible
- » Division President can stand for re-election only once



- » The division president has to:
 - Represent the division in three F2F meetings each year
 - October (Ismaning), February (Europe), April (EGU GA)
 - Act as Division Programme chair
 - Review and sort the GA sessions
 - Consolidate sessions after abstracts have been reviewed by conveners
 - Allocate oral/poster/PICO session
 - Identify people to do the real jobs:
 - Division medal committees
 - ECS representatives
 - Session conveners
 - Support provided by EGU and Copernicus.org



Open Access Journals in EGU

- » Geoscientific Instrumentation, Methods and Data Systems (GI). Topics:
 - Retrieval techniques of scientific products from measurements;
 - Calibration and data quality assessment;
 - Uncertainty in measurements;
 - Newly developed and planned research platforms and community instrumentation capabilities;
 - Major national and international field campaigns and observational research programs;
 - New observational strategies to address societal needs in areas such as monitoring climate change and preventing natural disasters;





EGU Galileo conferences

Purpose:

- Bring together up to 100 participants for a 3-5 days meeting to discuss a well-focused cutting-edge topic at the frontier of geosciences research in a stimulating environment.
- Possibility to publish a special Galileo Conference proceeding issue in one of the EGU journals

Support:

- EGU is putting at the conveners disposal the conference organization tools web hosting, abstract, programme and registration management.
- EGU provides comprehensive organisational support by organizing e.g. venue, poster boards, catering, Wi-Fi facilities, etc. Thereby the organising committee can fully focus on the scientific aspects of the conference.
