Report on 2008:

Manuel Grande reports on EGU and on 2008 PS results:

- EGU is growing 13000 papers 9000 attendees reflected in three 'legs' of organisation Program committee, Publications, EONS
- This should be reflected at division level to maintain 'bottom-up' approach
- 21 sessions and 542 papers in 2009 slightly down
- Finances in good shape Vienna makes a surplus New EGU President Tuija Pulkinnen
- Vienna is likely 2010 & 2011 venue
- New Executive secretary approached to replace retiring Arne Richter

President transition

Manuel Grande talks abourt the nomination of 3 candidates for PS President and the elections. He hands over the Presidency to new elected President, Athena Coustenis. Coustenis asks Grande to take the position of Deputy President. Grande accepts for at least one year.

New office

Coustenis reminds the attendants of the terms for officers: each Division should appoint a Vice-President, "Science Secretaries" and "Outreach Secretaries"

- 1. So far, Division President are elected in a general election amongst all EGU members for a period of 2 years with the possibility of an immediate re-election for another 2 years once only. The other Division officers are in general, appointed at the division business meetings. In order to organize appointments in a more transparent and bottom-up way, we propose the following for the future:
 - the terms of office for the Division Vice-Presidents and Secretaries are also limited to max. 4 years
 - for each vacancy the community associated with a Division is invited to propose appropriate candidates in an "open call-for-candidates".
 - the Division President is elected in a real election amongst the EGU members associated with the respective Division (At the moment each EGU member can

only vote for one candidate in one Division).

2. Science Secretaries

The "Science Secretaries" should guarantee that the sciences associated with a Division are fully and as widely as possible represented in all of the activities of the Division and thereby of the Union. These are, e.g., the General Assemblies, the Topical Conferences, Workshops, Special Courses, Summerschools etc., the publications such as journals, book series and magazines, as well as the awards and medals. Either directly or via separate Division Committees and Boards, such as, e.g., the boards of editors or the awards & medal committees, these "Science Secretaries" would then "network" with the EGU Committees, such as, e.g., the EGU Meeting/Programme Committee, the EGU Publication Committee or the EGU Award & Medal Committee in a way we still have to determine.

3. Outreach Secretaries

The "Outreach Secretaries" should guarantee that their Division is well represented in the more science-administrative and science-political as well as the outreach and educational activities of the Union. So, e.g., we SUGGEST that each Division appoints at least a:

- Secretary for News & Information for the Division Web-Site, for the EGU Newsletter or as contract partner for the EGU Media activities (media.egu.eu).
- Secretary for Education who will guarantee a sophisticated programme for the younger and more recently established geoscientists in form of special sessions at the General Assemblies, such as, e.g., Special Courses and Workshops, or Workshops and Summerschools outside of the General Assemblies, and who will foster a strong liaison to the universities, colleges and high-schools, and will serve as contact partner for the EGU programme "Geo-Information for Teachers (GIFT)" at gift.egu.eu.
- Secretary for Outreach and International Affaires as the promoter for a tight liaison to industry, science-administrative and -political organizations on a European level, as well as to other scientific societies and unions. This secretary might serve as contact partner for Division and Union activities such as, e.g., job market, advertisements and sponsorship.

Secretary for Internal Affairs who would be responsible on the Division level for the finances, the nominations and elections, as well as for a close interaction and cooperation with the corresponding scientific community and with the various bodies of the Union.

These "Outrooch Secretaries" would then "notwork" with the EGLI Committees, such as a general contraction.

These "Outreach Secretaries" would then "network" with the EGU Committees, such as, e.g., the EGU Nomination Committee, the EGU Finance Committee or the EGU Forum on Education, Outreach, News & Sponsorship (EONS) in a way we still have to determine.

Proposal to have separate people responsible for Program, Publications, Outreach Program Committee and secretaries for :

Plasmas, Outer Planets, Dust and small bodies, Terrestrial Planets, Techniques/exploration, Origins, Exoplanets
