Report of the 2010 Ocean Science Division Business Meeting (page1/2)

The busines meeting of the Ocean Science Division of the EGU was held during the EGU 2010 General Assembly on Thursday 6 May 2010, in Room 6 of the Conference Centre, (from 12h15 to 13h15).

The attendance was over 100 persons. The agenda included 10 items, and all have been discussed (see the slides attached). The most important outcomes of the meeting discussions are summarized below. This report has been written by Bernard Barnier, the OSD president, with the help of the OS Division Officers.

Item 1 – Election of the OSD president for the next term.

Bernard Barnier, present President elect will run for a second term. No other candidate was proposed.

Items 3&4 –Awards:

The 2009 YSOPP award was given to ZiYuan Hu (PhD student at Université de Marseille), and Alexander Barth was congratulated by the Division for his 2010 OYS Union award.

Item 5 – Division OYS award.

The assembly was informed that the OS Division will have an Outstanding Young Scientist Award in 2010. The OSD winner will be proposed for the Union OYS award. The rule established by the EGU Council is that if the winner of the division OYS gets the union award, there will be no division award that year. The assembly asked almost unanimously that this rule be changed. This request was reported by the OS President to the Council the next day who did not want to consider it for the moment, with the argument that the rule established by the council last year should not be changed before being applied and evaluated.

Item 6 – Organisation of the OS Division.

The new organisation of the OS Division has been presented by the president and approved. Briefly, after working for more than 4 years in the OS Division, Peter Koltermann (Tsunami Unit, Unesco) is leaving the position of vice president and Ruth Preller (NRL, USA) is leaving the position of science secretary for operationnal oceanography. They are respectively replaced in these positions by Peter Brandt (IFM-GEOMAR, Kiel) and by Michel Rixen (Nato La Spezia, Italy). The Outreach activities of the Division need to be developed, and the Division mentioned that discussion were going on with Vinca Rosmorduc (CLS, Toulouse) for an Outreach secretary position in OSD.

Item 7 – Fridtjof Nansen Medal Committee

The nomination of Peter Koltermann as Chair of the Nansen Medal Committee was proposed and was approved unanimously by a vote of the assembly.

Item 8 - 2010 General Assembly

The assembly was globally pleased by the 2010 meeting and its organization (including the reservation of TB5 for posters). The feedback regarding the PSD was generally positive, although it seems that it did not work well for a few sessions. Participants suggested that it would be an improvement if a room could be dedicated to PSD during the whole week during TB3 or TB4, at the same floor where the OS sessions occur. This room should be the same for all OS sessions and for the whole week, and would be used by the sessions having their posters in TB5 on the same day.

Item 9 - Ocean Science Journal

A summary of the publication activity of the Ocean Science Journal was presented. EGU members were invited to propose themselves as topic editors (renewal is necessary), and to submit papers. Publication in OS will still be free of charge until the end of 2010.

Item 10 - Other issues

The OS President asked that other issues not discussed at this meeting could be sent by email after the meeting. Among those submitted, two appear worth being mentioned.

To improve poster sessions, it was suggested that poster session on Friday in the morning and the session names should be better indicated (instead of the alphanumeric codes) above the posters.

A question was raised was whether EGU would considered implementing some form of virtual conferencing, i.e. making presentations (or even podcasts) available to remote registrants (on a voluntary basis with permission of presenters). This might help to reduce travel by the community and thus help to set a good example in terms of carbon consciousness to rest of the (scientific) community on travel.

The meeting was adjourned after no other items was proposed to discussion.
