

- Conveners must allocate 3 poster judges per poster/PICO
- Evaluations online at EGU OSPP judge app
- OS Division select the winning poster(s) or PICO(s)
- There must be at least two reviews to evaluate the poster/PICO!!!
- 71 entrants this year (guideline 1 award per 30 entrants)

- invitation to EGU GA in 2020 (no registration fees)
- publication of related paper in EGU journal is free of charge



## GA 2019 statistics (as of 5 April 2019, 16:48)


- 16,250 abstracts in programme | -6.2% relative to 2018
- (16,922 active abstracts 29 Jan 2019)
- 5,531 orals | 9,432 posters | 1,287 PICOs | ratio 34 / 58 / 8
- 14,283 registrations in advance | +12.17%
- 683 unique scientific sessions | 87 short courses | 338 side events\* (total 1108)
- 508 out of 683 scientific sessions are co-organized (74.4%), thereof 24 ITS
- Original sessions 1471; 1108 still active, 363 withdrawn

\*Side events include the programme groups MAL, PCN, FAM, TSM, SEV, PC, PPAA




#### Abstracts in programme 2005 – 2019


# 2018 withdrawal of no-show abstracts

9 Early Career Scientist Travel Awards for OS scientists and 1 Established Scientist Travel Award (8 in 2018)

OS in total 1986 abstracts submitted, 1892 current, in 84 sessions (1629/46 in 2017; 1314/53 in 2018) 710 Orals (38%); 1086 Posters (57%); 96 PICOs (5%)

**OS** led

676 abstracts in 27 sessions (726/19 in 2017; 577/20 in 2018) 244 Orals (36%); 377 Posters (56%); 55 PICOs (8%)

49% of OS abstracts from Early Career Scientists
