3. General Assembly 2013

EGU overall slightly decreased since 2011, the final tally of HS is 1752 abstracts

- EGU: 13370 abstracts, 4691 oral (33%), 8225 posters (67%), 454
 PICOs
- HS: 587 orals (34%), 1142 posters (65%), 23 PICOs (1%)
- HS program comprises 68 sessions

- 85 posters in the competition (2012: 184, 2011: 94)
- 48 sessions (2012: 59), with ~140 judges (2011: 160+)
- Judges: please pick up your judging forms at the EGU information desk and drop them off there as well

Procedure

 (PhD-) students register their wish to enter the competition after acceptance of abstract (via the link in the letter of schedule)

3 judges per poster

- Criteria: scientific quality, presentation, and discussion
- Top 1-5 of the ranked posters win the OSP Award

Benefits

- short presentation on the EGU website
- conference fee waived for the next GA
- when the work is subsequently published in HESS, the page charges will be waived

13. Room distribution in 2013 and in the future

The second half of the week we will only have one large room. Please report back to me (hs@egu.eu) how this worked out, particularly if you missed talks because the room was full.

Convenors: photographs of packed rooms might help persuade the Program Committee Chair to make this a one-time mishap.

HS ideally needs two rooms of 300-500 seats, two with 200-300 seats, and one with 100 seats. The red level does not have intermediate size rooms, but two excellent large rooms and a nice poster area.

The only realistic alternatives seem to be the blue and yellow levels:

Yellow: Four large rooms, posters in another building









EGU General Assembly 2013 Blue Level – Basement Access to Poster Halls XL | X | Y
